STATE TAKE OUT ITS QUOTA Firms reminded of jobless agreement

THE Kenya Government is to start taking out its quota of 15 per cent more staff through the recruiting machinery set up under the separate agreement it made with employers and workers. This was decided yesterday by the Cabinet Committee on Unemployment Relief, which met under the chairmanship of the Minister for Labour, Mr. Mwendwa.

It was decided to set up a small inter-ministerial committee to complete the Government's recruiting plans. A Kenya News Agency statement said that the Cabinet Committee had received a number of reports on the scheme and wished certain points to be made clear to all employers.

Only those who have complied fully with the official arrangements for recruiting their staff are deemed to have complied with the agreement. Workers who have not registered and those registered who have not been officially referred (on a "D" form) to the employer cannot count against a quota.

S. RHODESIA SAYS 'HANDS OFF' TO BRITAIN

THE Southern Rhodesian Government yesterday announced it would resist a bill coming to Britain to give Rhodesia the right to send its own troops to South Africa for internal affairs.

The bill included an amendment to the Rhodesian Frontier Defence Act which would require that British soldiers sent to South Africa be sent there for internal affairs.

At a news conference after the bill was introduced in the House of Commons, Rhodesia's Minister of Defence, Mr. M. M. M. M., said that his government would resist the bill as it would mean that British troops would be sent to South Africa for internal affairs.

Plaques to be issued

Plaques showing that an employer has complied with the agreement will be issued by Labour Officers only when the employer has returned a properly completed "D" Form showing which of the men referred to him has taken the initiative.

The special procedure adopted to enable employers to nominate transfer candidates in future applies only to the case of skilled jobs where suitable workers are available. Where no such workers are available, special authority must be obtained in each instance, from a Labour Officer.

The Government will view with extreme disfavour any employer who attempts to recruit his quota on a tribal basis or who is in any other way discriminating on the basis of his unskilled labour. It is the intention of the parties to the agreement that all registered workers should enjoy equally classification should have an equal chance of getting a job through the scheme.
