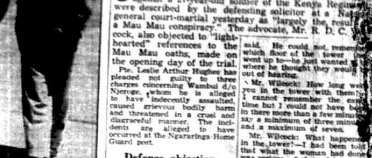

Penalties for Arson

Provisional act has been taken
on the advice of the War Council,
to introduce what it is hoped
will be deterrent penalties in
respect of Arson. The Emergency
Regulations, which are now
numerous and have mainly been
introduced to provide a minimum
sentence of 14 years' imprisonment
and the offence of "having with him"
any "explosive material" has been
increased to 20 years.

THE OFFICIAL STATEMENT

The expression "having with him"
has been defined as "having in his
possession or control" and it is
now possible to cover "all persons"
who are in the vicinity of the
crime as "property by fire or
explosion" by the person having
any aim for such use by him-
self or a provisionally defined
"very rarely used in the laws of
the country" and it is hoped that
this will be deterrent in the
case of persons of low intelligence
who are in the vicinity of the
crime. The Regulations are
being made in the hope that
the Courts are asked to decide
in favour of the Government
provision in his or her own
discretion.

ARSON IS A GRAVE CRIME

Soviet unlikely to mount surprise attack

A SUDDEN surprise attack against the West
by the Soviet Union is most unlikely at present,
according to officials of the Supreme Headquarters

U.N. approves investment resolutions

A RESOLUTION embodying a series of recommendations regarding the Economic and Social Council's investment has been approved by the United Nations Conference on Economic and Social Problems, which met in Geneva, Switzerland, last week.

Greater capital for the investment has been recommended by the conference. It also recommended that the United Nations should avoid undue taxation and discrimination in the investment of capital.

MACHINERY MARKET IN EGYPT

THE potential importance of Egypt as a market for British exports was stressed by Mr. Leslie M. Secretary of the British Commercial Embassy in Cairo, speaking to manufacturers in Harrogate yesterday.

Mr. Minton stated that Egypt now has plenty of steel and machinery. He stated that the Egyptian market was wide open to British machinery, transport, irrigation and land reclamation machinery, and telecommunication machinery.

NO LACK OF CONFIDENCE IN STERLING

Drop in Britain's reserves 'gratifyingly small'

NOVEMBER'S drop of \$1,000,000 in Britain's gold and foreign exchange reserves, reported by the Treasury, is regarded by London experts as gratifyingly small.

Effects of the drop are being attributed to the increase in the rate of exchange and the depreciation of the pound sterling.

CARPENTER PLAN GRIED IN PRINCIPLE African wages rise but met half-way BURY PROPOSED INTO RURAL PROBLEMS

Kenya Government yesterday made known its views on the Carpenter Committee Report in a White Paper presented to the Legislative Council.

The formula recommended by the Committee, including the basic "adult" minimum wage, to be assessed at 25 times the basic "youth" minimum wage, the Government felt that it would be a step to involve the Colony in a commitment which is negligible at present.

It is felt that it is better to aim in the future at an "adult" wage based on what is sufficient to maintain a man and wife, but that in the interim there should be a trend towards an "adult" wage sufficient to meet the needs of a man, wife and children.

The Government's immediate proposal is to move from a basic "youth" minimum wage of 15/- to the basic revised "youth" minimum wage which is to be brought into force in the New Year. The "adult" wage to be achieved not by fixed annual increases but "as far as may be practicable in the circumstances" and not by fixed annual increases.

It is thought that if conditions are favourable the goal of 25 times the "youth" wage should be attainable in the near future.

The White Paper refers to the establishment of a new Social Security Committee. It asserts that the present economic and other circumstances make a major aim of the Government to improve the economic and social conditions of the Colony.

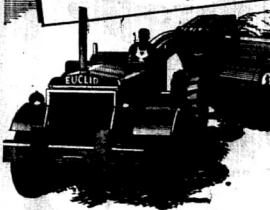

FRENCH APPROACH RUSSIA FOR PACT WITH BRITAIN AND U.S.

Move supported by Britain and U.S. PROPOSALS MAY LEAD TO FOUR-POWER CONFERENCE

PARIS, December 8.—The French Government has started diplomatic preparations for a four-power talks with Russia by instructing her Moscow envoy to ask whether Russia is willing to discuss a new condition for signing an Atlantic State Treaty.

The possibility of such talks in Paris next May was suggested by M. Mendes-France, the French Premier, when he addressed the United Nations General Assembly last month. A Foreign Office spokesman said in London that the British and United States Governments had been informed of the proposed French approach and had offered no objections.

The French Chargé d'Affaires in Moscow, M. Jean Lery, is putting the request before the Soviet Government. The new condition is that all Russian, British, French and American troops should be withdrawn from Austria progressively within 18 to 24 months of the treaty being signed. The Russians wanted no time-limit to be fixed.

M. Mendes-France is understood to consider the new approach to be the first step in the diplomatic preparation of a major conference with the Russians. He suggested to the United Nations Assembly that this might culminate in a four-power meeting in Paris next May—the earliest date available after the ratification of the Paris treaty for German rearmament could be expected to complete.

When the French Premier saw the Austrian Chancellor, Dr. Julius Raab, in New York the day after his United Nations speech, Dr. Raab agreed to the new proposal.

The Berlin four-power committee of the United Nations negotiations broke down because of disagreement between the United States and the Soviet Union. The latter's proposals for a four-power meeting in Paris next May—the earliest date available after the ratification of the Paris treaty for German rearmament could be expected to complete.

Uganda cotton crop sales suspended

BRITISH BUYING PRICES HIGH

ASIAN PROGRAMME PROPOSAL

The U.S. Secretary of State, Mr. John Foster Dulles, said in Washington the Eisenhower Administration had accepted the principle that highly developed countries should assist the economic development of nations in Asia and other areas. He said it was likely that the administration would submit an Asian development programme to the new Congress in January.

Mr. Dulles said that normally the best way for the private capital to undertake development programmes with the Government concentrating on creating a suitable investment climate. But he acknowledged that under stable political conditions it was possible for the Government itself to play an active role.

A report on this development will be sent to the Cabinet.

Economic competition

Mr. Dulles said the present phase of the struggle between the United States and the Soviet Union had shifted to economic competition. He said that the line being to economic competition is to be maintained by open military activities.

The United States Government therefore proposed to give priority to the economic development of the world. He said that the problem had been discussed by the President and Mr. Dulles. He said that the Government would be asked if the preparation of a report on this subject.

U.K. STABILITY IMPROVING

BRITISH economy continues to show signs of stability during the first half of the year, according to a report published yesterday.

Confidence in the strength of the pound has been demonstrated by a continued growth in exports and a consequent strengthening of the sterling. The report also stated that the Government had taken steps to improve the balance of payments.

Union urged to ease problem

FURTHER criticism of South Africa's racial policies was voiced at the United Nations by the special political committee of the General Assembly resumed its debate on the apartheid issue.

Most of the speakers at the first session were among the sponsors of a draft resolution submitted to the committee yesterday.

The resolution, sponsored by the United Nations Council and invited the South African Government to condemn its institutions under the United Nations Charter.

It also asks the Union to take into consideration the suggestions of the committee for a peaceful solution of the problem.

The sponsors of the resolution are Afghanistan, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Costa Rica, Egypt, Ethiopia, Haiti, India, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Lebanon, Liberia, Pakistan, the Philippines, Saudi Arabia, Syria, Yemen and Yugoslavia.

Mr. U. Khan Mang of Burma, in his concluding remarks, stressed the importance of fundamental human rights.

World danger
He noted that the matter of the racial situation in the United Nations had been raised and decided by an overwhelming majority of members.

He expressed the hope that South Africa would review the situation and take measures to a just and cooperative manner to solve the problem.

There was no mention of interesting in South Africa's domestic situation.

It would be a good feature if the British Government, Mr. H. S. Pater, an Irish Member, would take up the question of revising the agreement made with the East African mainland strip enhanced by the 'new water' he said.

Speaking on constitutional arrangements in which the Tanganyika Government recently took the lead in East Africa, Mr. Pater said that during the past 12 years different communities in Zanzibar had provided with the authorities allow more citizens to take part in the administration of their country.

Mr. John Rankine, the former British Resident, had held discussions with the Protectorate and on leaving had paid back to the United Kingdom a report on the country's political and economic development.

"My advice is that the time has now come when Zanzibar should be constituted as a separate unit of the United Kingdom," he said. "The hand of the Colonial Secretary should be laid on the other. This people want and make their own development."

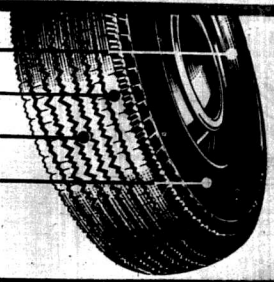
