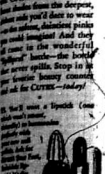

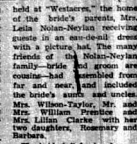

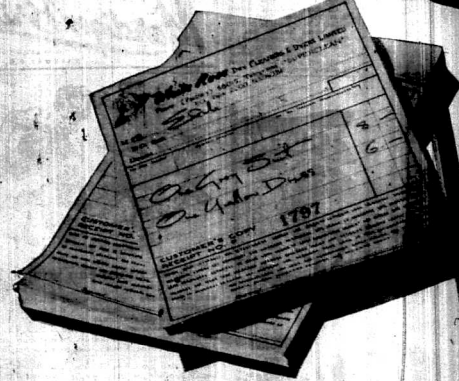

world, are lined with two stop-watches. The operator listens "vaguely" to the call during the whole period of its duration. One stop-watch times the full duration of the call. The other is sounding the seconds only. The operator calls and receives a call is charged only for that period over which reception is satisfactory at both ends.

Then there is a separate switchboard which deals with all inquiries; a switchboard with a telephone reference library at its disposal. And the engineer's test room which includes giving the fault history of every line.

The school

HERE in Telephone House, too, is training school for new operators, who do a six-week course. Two weeks' practical training on the switchboard before they are taken on to the permanent staff.

The school has a set of equipment which is similar to the equipment to study and to practice the whole range of a telephone man from another through the exchange, to another subscriber.

Important, as well, is the fact that they are taught correct telephone manners. "You smile in your voice," operators on the classroom walls are reminded, and the "wonders of this building are amazing and the mind bewildering. There is the 'carrier' room through which the speech channels and the telephone channels go, and the battery room which runs the whole exchange, and which has batteries.

There is, too, a stand-by generating plant which ensures that power cuts or the telephone system will still work. Thanks to new equipment many exchanges in East Africa can now dial direct to subscribers in other towns without going through the exchange of that town. A similar link of cables passing to and from the main exchange in Nairobi, Dar es Salaam, Mombasa, Kisumu, Juba and Kampala.

And there are still new wonders in the air, the type of party line exchange which will eliminate the nuisance of all subscribers having to answer a new type of telephone communication which works by radio from the subscriber's phone itself.

Rapid growth

THE growth of telephone communications in East Africa in recent years probably has been remarkable than anywhere else in the world.

Trunk calls, for instance, have increased by 20 per cent since 1952. Then there were 100,000. Today the figure is 120,000. Local calls in 1952 were in the region of 21 million. In the first half of 1953 alone they had reached a total of 11 million.

Out of 10,000 new lines demanded, 10,000 have been supplied.

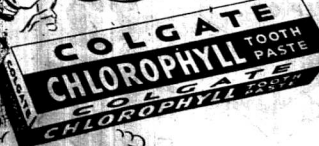

KENYA JUDGES PRAISED

Q.C. on responsibility for civil justice

JUDGES and the legal profession in Kenya were doing their utmost to maintain the traditions of British justice. This opinion was expressed on Tuesday by Sir Hartley Shawcross, Q.C., who was Attorney-General in the last Colonial Government. He left Nairobi by air for Britain.

He arrived on Friday to represent the Anglo-Italian Oil Co. on an appeal by an Italian tanker master against a verdict of the Indian Supreme Court that 100 tons of kerosene oil taken from his ship, the *Mary*, after nationalisation, still remained the property of the Italian tanker.

"Depends on laymen"
After Sir Hartley's address had been stressed to the fact that certain criticisms had been made in Britain on aspects of the administration of justice in the Colony, he commented that he was convinced that judges and the legal profession were doing their best to maintain the traditions of justice.

"But" he went on to point out, "justice does not depend simply on the professional people. It depends on the laymen; it depends on the citizen, and the impartiality of the police, witness and juror."

"I am not altogether happy about these matters," he said, "in the run of the day, the maintenance of law and order, I hope that success will crown the efforts now being made to establish

"For that reason it is not in my mind a matter of liability for the respective forms of procedure and for the trials of soldiers and civilians for ordinary civil offences.
