## FRANCE TO DEFEY WARNING BY RUSSIA

### Paris ratification annuls 1944 pact

#### WEST ALLIES START ON ATOMIC STRATEGY

FRANCE has proclaimed its readiness to annul the 1944 Franco-Soviet Treaty of Friendship and Alliance, which was signed in Moscow on December 10, 1944. It is, in such a manner, underlining its determination to conduct its foreign policy on an independent basis.

The French Prime Minister, Guy Mollet, was speaking at the opening session of the North Atlantic Council's two-day conference on atomic strategy, held in the Palais de Chaillot, 14 member nations assembled in the Palais de Chaillot.

Early agreement was reached on one of the main issues - whether to give military commanders a free hand with provisional plans for their possible use in any new form of defence strategy. It was agreed that the defence strategy should be based now on the employment of such arms.

The council also agreed to let the decision on the use of nuclear weapons rest with the Governments rather than give military commanders a free hand.

France-Soviet Treaty provides that neither party should use atomic weapons without consulting the other in advance. The treaty also provides that the two parties should consult each other in advance of any use of atomic weapons.

The French Government has also announced that it will not be a party to any agreement which would give military commanders a free hand with provisional plans for their possible use in any new form of defence strategy.



#### RENEWED ATTEMPT FOR NEUTRALISED GERMANY

**RUSSIA** yesterday threatened to cancel the Anglo-Soviet Treaty if the Paris agreement for a rearmament Western Germany was ratified. This warning was contained in a Note delivered to the British Ambassador in Moscow.

The threat is similar to one which M. Molotov, Russian Foreign Minister, made in a speech at the North Atlantic Council in Paris that French-Franco-British pact would be null and void if the agreement for the rearmament of Western Germany was ratified in London in 1942. Operation of the treaty will provide for either side going to aid if the other is involved in hostilities with Germany. Under Article I, each side undertakes not to conclude any agreement with the other.

Parliament approved the pact in November. The House of Lords being so without a vote. That left the way clear for ratification and a debate was expected before the end of the year.

The Soviet Union in deplorable efforts to prevent ratification has already threatened to raise a cloud of Communist arms production if Western Germany is rearmament.

## REPLIES BY RUSSIA ON TALKS BOYCOTT

RUSSIA has released five copies of Notes sent to Finland, Sweden, Denmark, Switzerland and Austria — on their replies to her invitation to a European security conference in Moscow last month. Invitations were sent on November 15 to all European countries with whom the Soviet Union had relations in the United States. All decisions were taken at the conference which was held on November 15-16 in Moscow. The conference was attended by 14 Communist countries and 10 Chinese observers.

The Note to Switzerland 'regretted' her refusal to take part in the conference. Austria had in explained it could take part in the talks only if all the States occupying the country took part.

'Threat increased' The Note asked the Governments of France, Britain and the United States, 'Arriving to simple terms their plans for the renunciation of Western Germany, had rejected the Soviet proposal that there should be the conditions necessary to secure a successful conference on aspects of European security.'

The Note said the plan to rearm West Germany could not be successful unless Austria had no real obstacles to the final settlement of the only safeguard.

The Note to Switzerland said that the Swiss Government had indicated that it was always ready, and is trying now to contribute to the cause of safeguarding peace and security in Europe.

The Swiss Government has decided that real security for Europe can be safe guaranteed only by abolishing the system of armaments. Western Germany and including other military armaments, and by creating an effective system of collective security in Europe.


