



French officials said yesterday the Soviet Union has proposed a formal economic and political marriage with France. The two nations are already linked by many trade agreements, although they have been unable to conclude a formal alliance.

We are in fear of being left progressively more and more behind if they remain in their present state of indecision."

KING OF LESOTHO ARRESTED Prime Minister acts after violence

PIER MOHOSHOESE of Lesotho was placed under house arrest in Maseru yesterday by his Prime Minister. Para-military police, armed with rifles and heavy equipment, ringed the redbrick palace and no one would be allowed to enter or leave without permission.

The Prime Minister, Chief Lesotho Jonathan, moved directly overnight after disturbances on Tuesday in which 10 people, including a police constable, were killed and more than 10 injured.

At least 150 people were arrested without charge because of the royal village of Thaba-Tseka, 15 miles from Maseru, where the king was said to have been addressed as "Chief Jonathan" by those arrested. They were held incommunicado in secret cells at the palace.

Chief Jonathan, who had been independent of South Africa since he became King in October 4, was said to have been addressing constituents between the king and Chief Jonathan's Government, which greater power over the royal family he has had since his appointment as chief constable of the royal guard.

A Government spokesman said the king had been summoned to the palace to negotiate with the royal family.

The king was arrested when he returned to the palace after a walk through the royal village.

Chief Jonathan had taken a plain flight to the palace. He was at the Kabelana Hotel in Maseru when a South African plane took off with 100 passengers.

Two days later another South African plane was shot down as it was flying over the border of Rhodesia. The pilot, Captain Peter Williams, was killed. Two Rhodesians were also killed in the accident.

Williams had been flying a state aircraft carrying a state minister, the minister of defence, and other officials.

We will stand by our brothers in Rhodesia and South Africa and other countries of the continent in their struggle for democracy and attain genuine independence with our own freedom, which is the birthright of all Africa.

We are determined to remain members of the OAU to the end.

The OAU stands not as the African entity but as the entity of all Africa.

It is the duty of all Kenyans to support our brothers in their struggle for democracy and freedom. We seek to strengthen their working to achieve their goals.

It is only through a spirit of cooperation that we can succeed.
