Police await deportees

Two Greeks, expelled from the Congo after African Ministers had accused them of being Communists, were flown to Nairobi from Stanleyville in a refugee aircraft.

The men, who denied they were Communists, are Mr. Arjhrin Emmanuel and Mr. George Yannakis, they were kept at Nairobi during the 1,000-mile flight from the Congo. They take them to Paris.

Both men had residence permits for France and were unwilling to return to Athens. They arrived at Eastleigh at 1.45 a.m. yesterday on an R.A.F. Beverley which also carried more than 90 refugees from the Congo, including Britons, Americans, Canadians, Portuguese and Belgians.

More regions seek to join Katanga

BEAT THE DEAD IN CONGO

Brussels is unmoved by ultimatum

BELGIAN authorities were reported yesterday to be unmoved by a threat to call in Soviet help in the Congo.

The Congo Prime Minister, M. Lumumba, had warned in a letter sent to Dr. Ralph Bunche, United Nations representative in the Congo, that he would ask for Russian assistance if Belgian troops did not leave the country by today.

According to Belgian officials, the Belgian troops would remain in the Congo as long as they are considered necessary to protect Belgian lives and property. An official said: "We are keeping cool heads."

Further action planned

Belgian troops were reported to be holding about 20 key centres in the Congo yesterday, including Leopoldville Airport and the main towns in the breakaway Katanga Province, where they were reported to be using airliners and it was thought the Belgians were planning further action to rescue groups of their countrymen who were stranded in Oristral Province.

Meanwhile, the build-up of United Nations forces continued yesterday and Gen. Carl von Horn arrived in Leopoldville from Jerusalem under him but UN officials, harassed by the size and complexity of their task, have asked for this number to be doubled.

More trouble was reported yesterday from the area of Thysville, the town about 100 miles from Leopoldville which was one of the main trouble centres.

On Sunday, it was learned Leopoldville, being threatened by a Belgian reconnaissance plane, killing the pilot, and captured a radio transmitter, carrying several Belgian officials. A third Belgian aircraft which was to look for them returned to Leopoldville bullet-riddled with the pilot injured.

Coalition leader has 'impressed' Minister

THE leader of the Kenya Coalition delegation in London, Sir Ferdinand Cavendish-Bentinck, has established himself as a definite personality in Kenya politics when the Colonial Secretary would welcome at any time.

Lord Deloraine said this in Nairobi yesterday on his return from London, where he has been working in connection with the Coalition delegation in its second approach to the British Government.

"Sir Ferdinand has emerged as a figure paraded in political circles of importance in Mr. Bond's London Department of work, and because of this he has been able to accompany him has been able to make first-hand reports with important business interests."

Through his personal attitude Sir Ferdinand had taken Mr. Bond's view of the situation on economic aspects, and he has been able to represent responsible interests throughout Kenya.

Committee plan

Sir Ferdinand proposed to set up a London committee composed of Sir Bond, Sir Ferdinand and other representatives to represent to the Colonial Secretary the views of the Kenya people.

It was expected that he would complete his discussions in London by the middle of next month.

Peasants flee as Etna erupts

LAVA ASH SHOWERS COASTAL SHIPPING

ASHES and pebbles showered ships off the coast of Sicily yesterday as Mount Etna erupted in a blaze of fire and lava. A huge mushroom smoke- cloud gushed 20,000ft into the air after the volcano's loudest explosion in living memory.

Lava ran down the mountain slopes a search began for the central crater and French officials reported it was called off after it was reported there had not been seen on the slope to the summit. The eruption lasted about 60 minutes and caused great areas of bushes and rocks and chunks of lava the size of buses buried high into the air. Calm followed but there was no indication of a lull in the lava flows from the crater area of about 100 square miles blanketed in lin. of ash and pebbles.

Like storm bomb

The cloud of smoke resembled the aftermath of an atomic bomb. It stretched the sky for miles and was so hot that it alarmed signal for villages living close by the mountain. Lava immediately began to flow swiftly down the mountain slopes. The explosion in the central crater, described by scientists at the Institute of Volcanology at Catania as "strongly explosive", happened at 10.50 G.M.T.

The smaller explosion followed in a matter of minutes and covered a wide area, and the lava covered roads.

Reports said there was no immediate danger, but they did not exclude the possibility of fresh eruptions.

Thousands of peasants living near the slopes were reported to be fleeing towards Catania. A policeman at Linguaglossa, in the foothills, said the eruption was "terrifying" but there had been no reports of serious casualties so far. (See Comment in Page 4)

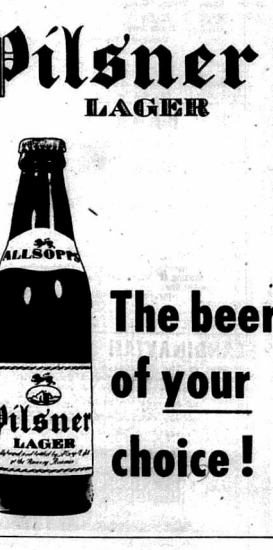

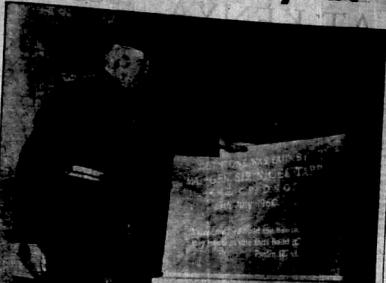

BLUEBIRD LAPS AT 50 M.P.H.
