GOOD WORK ON TAVETA SCHEMES

GOOD progress is being made on the irrigation schemes in the Taveta District, for which the Government has provided funds amounting to £200,000.

At present, 1,500 acres are grown on land which was previously desert. A further 1,500 acres will be irrigated by the end of next year, and the total area under cultivation will be increased to 3,000 acres by the end of 1957.

With the increase in the number of schemes, the interest of local people in agriculture has increased on irrigation farms and the scheme is now being developed by the District Officer, Mr. E. Thompson. It is hoped that the schemes will help to develop the economy of the area, and the improvements will be continued, so that more and more land can be converted into arable land.

Statement by the Chairman, Mr. John S. Schlesinger

IT IS MY PLEASURE TO present to you the results of your Society's operations for the year 1955. The figures show a substantial increase over last year, and all Departments have progressed satisfactorily.

New Business Envelope 36 Million Pounds

I am able to report that new business written during 1955, after deduction of reinsurance, amounted to £20,811,760, being an increase of £3,029,771. However, in addition to a Persian Gulf Reinsurance Scheme for your Society's Inside and Overseas Gulf which entailed the issue of policies totalling £1,077,000, there was a total new business figure of £36,000,172, which represents an increase of 10% in the Ordinary and Industrial Departments.

Premium Income

The total premium income for the year was £4,619,584, of which £3,407,030 came from the Ordinary Department and the balance from the Industrial Department. These figures reflect a steady forward trend.

Funds Excess to Premiums

For the year ended 31st December, 1955, the funds available for investment were £1,081,532 and the balance £1,080,000.

Benefit Paid

During 1955 a total sum of £1,081,532 was paid out in benefits, including State Benefits, Death, Maternity, Learning, Endowment, Old Age and Annuity Payments £36,587.

Prizes

For the year ended 31st December, 1955, a sum of £10,000 was given away in prizes on an average of £100 per year, with the largest amount of £100 given to the men away, plus winning




