The representative of the United Kingdom Government in Kenya, Mr. G. M. Kariuki, has announced that the Government of Kenya will introduce immigration controls from July 1, 1962. This will mean that all persons wishing to enter Kenya from July 1, 1962, will be required to hold a passport and a visa. CHILD CARE BY AN AFRICAN MOTHER

Health and welfare experts have written books, given lectures and held innumerable courses to teach African mothers how to care for their children — but a slim booklet in simple Swahili is probably the first of its type to be written by an African mother to help her sisters.

Mrs. Malindi Likimani is an expert in home training and welfare work, she qualified at the London School of Tropical Medicine and lectures on nutrition for the African Mother. She is also a Kikuyu by birth.

Her book, "The Care of Children," was written by Mrs. Likimani, who is very simply with the feeling and practicality of a mother.

"The money you spend on your children's food is money well spent, for it will be spent on their health and their happiness when their children are grown up and are properly fed," Mrs. Likimani writes.

She also into considerable detail about the choice and preparation, at each stage of the child's development, of the foods most readily available.

Since many of the toddlers are admitted to hospitals suffering from kwashiorkor, simply because their mothers do not know what food is needed for a properly balanced diet, are the children of neglected and overworked women, there seems to be a great need for this booklet.

KEEPING OUT THE COLD

More out-of-school problems for the girls

MANY teachers would agree with me that the problems of girls' education in Kenya African schools far exceed those of boys.

The number of girls in every school, whatever the size, seems to double with the original five or six or seven children.

Throughout the intermediate school, girls seem to drop out so that, of the original five or six or seven children, only one or two are left at the end of the year.

Does this mean that the intelligence of girls is naturally less than that of boys? Certainly not.

All passed

My class of six children had five girls sitting for K.P.E. last year, but all of them passed and two went to secondary schools in another class, a girl led the boys throughout the year.

One reason why the education of girls may be neglected in most schools is that most of these schools are managed by male teachers, and the subject of domestic science has long been a controversial one.

How can men efficiently teach girls in matters pertaining to the home? So the subject of domestic science in most cases, comes to mean nothing more than knitting and a bit of darning in the evening hours.

This is made worse by lack of money for equipment and materials, so that if a little money is found for a sewing machine, there is none for the girls.

Speaking on the purposes of Kenya's African Women's Seminar, Mrs. Margaret Gecoo, secretary of the organizing committee, quoted the truism: "If you educate a man, you educate a family — and if you educate a woman you educate a family — and a nation."

Education of girls in East Africa has lagged behind that of their brothers, but it is not only lack of school places that has hindered many girls from reaching School Certificate standard or going on to higher education.

Here JOTHAM K. AUEGA, a teacher, suggests some other factors that make it hard for girls to become educated.

There being few girls in the intermediate schools they are not regarded with suspicion by the teachers who expect them to drop out.

Equal numbers

To fight this I suggest that boys and girls should be sent to intermediate schools in equal numbers and that all three competent women teachers be employed at each school.

This would mean that many training centers for women would be set up towards domestic science and introduced immediately.

Second problem lies in the home, rather than in the school.

The Minister of State for Constitutional Affairs and Economic Planning, Mr. Kenyatta, replied that he had no intention of giving any assurance, but added that the Government would not drive money out.

U.S. to probe for life on Mars

THE French Government has announced international measures against the extremist European Secret Army Organisation which has been waging a ferocious campaign in Algeria.

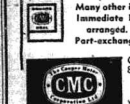

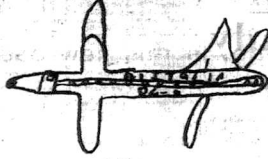
