£3m. GRANTS IN AID FOR UHURU

Fast U.K. aid for Tanganyika

SINCE independence was announced £2,779,706 in money assistance from the United Kingdom and local sources, all these figures which had been approved by the British Government, said the Parliamentary Secretary for Tanganyika, Mr. Sijonjo, during a question time in Parliament yesterday.

Mr. Sijonjo said in answering a question of Mr. E. Butler (Dorset) that His Majesty's Government of the United Kingdom intended to contribute £2,500,000 to the development of the Tanganyika railway, the cost of the railway to be met by the Government had been £2,225,000 towards the cost of the railway in Tanganyika, and £275,000 towards the cost of the railway in the United Kingdom.

New pressure baler

A group of New South Wales farmers have bought the cargo ship "Eros" (5,822 tons) to carry sheep and cattle from their properties to overseas markets. The ship is expected to be ready for service in about 1960.

MINISTER APPOINTS WORKING PARTY

The Minister for Agriculture, Mr. Michael Huddell, has appointed a working party to investigate the usage and marketing of fertilizers in Kenya. The party, under the chairmanship of Mr. E. K. Mwangi, Director of Agriculture, will examine the usage of fertilizers in both the Scheduled and Un-Scheduled areas.

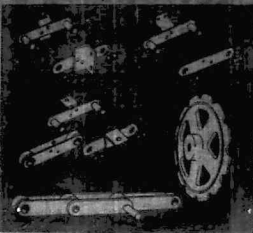

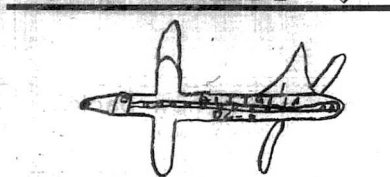

K.F.L. to keep general strike situation under constant review BOARD SET, BUT STRIKE GOES ON Coffee estates brought to standstill in Kiambu area

DESPITE the appointment of a Board of inquiry into the recognition dispute with the Coffee Growers' Association, the Sial and Coffee Plantation Workers' Union is to continue its strike which began yesterday morning.

The Kenya Federation of Labour's decision to call a general strike in support of the coffee workers will constantly be reviewed in the light of the board's inquiries.

These decisions were revealed in a Press statement issued by the federation's general secretary, Mr. P. F. O'Connell, yesterday evening. The statement said:

"The Kenya Federation of Labour has, in conjunction with the Sial and Coffee Plantation Workers' Union, fully considered the board of inquiry appointed by the Government to deal with the dispute between the union and the Coffee Growers' Association. In addition, the federation has had discussions with the Minister for Labour during the lunch hour today.

"Since the board has been appointed unconditionally, the union does not propose to withdraw from the strike now in the morning, the K.F.L. will continue to call for its case for recognition and for the right of access to accept work for the purpose of trade union organisations. The union has lodged a protest with the Minister for Labour concerning a dispute in respect of outstanding in the coffee industry. The Minister will advise the union of the machinery and manner in which it will operate."

Intimidation reports

"In demanding the general conditions of employment, the union has constantly been reminded of the strained relations between itself and the Coffee Growers' Association. Under the terms of the agreement, the union is to facilitate the work of the board by submitting to it its case for recognition and for the right of access to accept work for the purpose of trade union organisations. The union has lodged a protest with the Minister for Labour concerning a dispute in respect of outstanding in the coffee industry. Governor fears delay in talks on advance

London, (The Governor, Sir Patrick Bendon, said last night that his plan to speed up negotiations with the Kenya Milk Producers' Association might be delayed by special measures which may be taken to cover the strike situation.

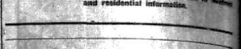

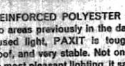
