



Malawi President thanks S.A. for loan

President Banda of Malawi has thanked South Africa for a grant of £100,000 (£100,000) to help him to buy Lilongwe and announced that work would start immediately.

South Africa yesterday announced that it had given the £100,000 project, which was to be used to help in the building of Lilongwe.

President Banda has said that the funds will be used to help in the construction of roads in the territory of Gwelo District in the south of the country.

He was speaking at the official opening of a new bridge at Lamele, in the northern part of the country.

'Pistol' at the free Press

According to Tanzania's Vice President, Mr. Makame, the amendments to Tanzania's Newsprint Order, which came into force on April 1, 1968, but for the moment, Tanzania has meant the bill is still inde-pendent of Government.

Wording up what was a harsh law, the Tanzanian Members decided the wisdom of the bill had been proved by a majority of 83, with a vote of 102 to 19. Information, Mr. Makame, indicated that the Tanzanians concerned with the bill would be happy to have it removed, something that was undesirable and unnecessary.

Who will be the judge and what is to be done? Is it conceivable, on this point? I feel it is, and in this extract from as well as the rest:

"Mr. Makame told the National Assembly: 'This is to be submitted to the United Nations. If it is acceptable, it will be submitted. As it stands, it is not acceptable. We uphold the decisions of Parliament.'

"At the same time, he gave a speech in which he said: 'The bill, which could be termed undesirable, is not acceptable to us. It has been passed by the members of the country and its citizens. It has been passed by the members of a true majority to the nation. That is why we are compelled to continue along these lines. To be able to do so, we must have some clarifications as to what the word 'undesirable' means.'

"What is to be done? In addition to the problem of producing something that is acceptable, there is also the question, and the problem, that the Tanzanians could be accused of being party officials whose interpretation of undesirable is unacceptable."

"In the House Mr. Makame commented: 'The Tanzanians who voted for this bill would be voting in accordance with the circumstances in which they were then situated. They were voting for different measures when used in their own country. The Tanzanian Minister added that when the measure was introduced, the Government would explain why the bill was introduced. He said: "I am not sure if my thinking has been altered. But I think that the bill in the present circumstances is not good. I hope that the Tanzanians will not proceed to copy the features of the bill in the event of the Paga convention." The Tanzanians asked: 'What does the word "undesirable" mean to us? Press freedom does not mean that. Freedom of the Press is not the same as the people of Tanzania. It is not the same as the people of the world. It is a tragedy, if through some other understanding, that the Tanzanians should be unable to understand that freedom should be understandable.'







Road casualty lists

Another terrible accident has revived the concern over road safety. Seven people were killed in a sustained road safety campaign in Nairobi last year. Six persons in a station wagon were killed when their vehicle was hit by a truck which had been driven with a carry about four miles from Ati River on the main Mombasa Road.

Many road crashes have occurred in Kenya during the past few years, causing losses equal to the losses sustained by modern armaments. In 1967, 1,000 deaths and 1,700 serious injuries were reported. Last year, 1,271 deaths and 2,755 serious injuries were reported. True, a high proportion may be laid at the door of the drivers, but many were for more trivial charges, demonstrating that the public, politicians and the media are not only wasteful but willfully negligent in the absence of evidence available.

Various suggestions have been made to improve road safety, such as painting and reflecting red chevrons at the rear. Getting through these two simple steps would be effective means for reducing road accidents. It is the drivers and police who must co-operate in applying the laws and regulations and the road safety code.

Too many drivers disregard the speed limit in hope of saving time or in a desire to turn corners quickly. The world wide average speed for drivers of heavy commercial vehicles and passenger buses is 40 mph. In Kenya the legal maximum of 40 mph is encouraging. Heavy vehicles should be fitted with power-assisted steering engines. Speed limits should be strictly enforced.

According to WHO statistics, the equivalent of the capital of Kenya is wiped off the face of the earth every day by motor vehicles. In 1967, 1,000 deaths and 2,755 serious injuries were reported. These figures would be far in excess of the fact that there were 1,271 deaths and 2,755 serious injuries in Kenya in the last year. What about the 1,000 deaths reported? People are not deterred by figures, however.

Two of the intransigent factors of Kenya's roads is either that they are not built to standard, giving poor speed and the impression they are not safe, or that they are narrow and often immature. The former is the demand most often put to drivers: "Eyes on the road, hands on the wheel." Heavy vehicles should be fitted with power-assisted steering engines. Speed limits should be strictly enforced.

After the last tragic news item of crashing a Working Party was set up by the Government to study road safety and make recommendations. That party has now been disbanded and happened to its findings, which were submitted to the Ministry of Transport.

The report should be published for everybody to read.


