Vietcong aim to cut off Saigon

Vietcong launched a pre-dawn bombardment of three key Saigon bridges, the city's civilian quarter and petrol installations close to the capital in a series of raids last night. 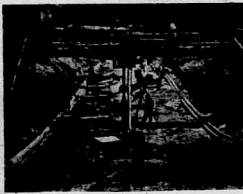

The South African Prime Minister, Mr. Vorster, said he was aware of the fact that certain States in Africa were busy preparing for an eventual joint attack on South Africa.

Addressing a meeting on the occasion of the celebration of the 20th anniversary of National Party Government, the Prime Minister said these African States were allowing themselves to be guided by the Communists. The plan was initially aimed against Portuguese territories and Rhodesia, but these people made no secret of the fact that their eventual aim was South Africa.

The Prime Minister said another danger which loomed for the country was that of the Communist bloc.

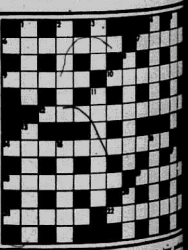
