Kenya's Attorney-General, Mr. Njonjo, yesterday warned that capital punishment may be introduced for criminals who carry firearms or pangas when carrying out thefts.

Mr. Njonjo is at present drafting amendments to the Penal Code which contain this clause. He will shortly put it before the National Assembly and ask the House to approve it.

In an interview yesterday, he said that robbery with violence, and carrying firearms, had become common in recent weeks and that many of the thieves involved in these cases had been carrying pangas or firearms. 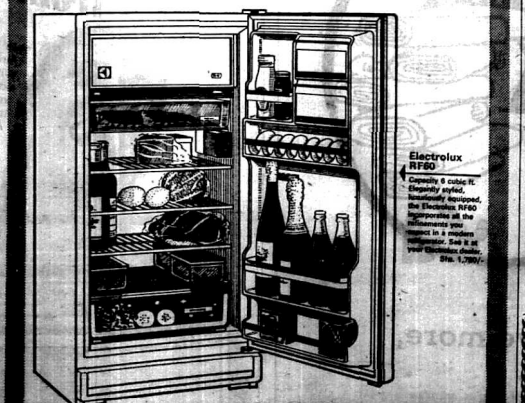

BACKGROUND TO THE NEWS

Death for panga raiders

In its determination to protect law-abiding people all races living in the country, the Kenya Government has reacted swiftly to the recent crop of crimes and violence. The Attorney General announced to the Senate amendments to the penal code providing the death sentence for conviction for thieves who carry pangas or firearms while about their nefarious business.

The amendments will require approval in the National Assembly, but so many Members of Parliament are so deeply concerned with the provincial administration and police, that Mr. Njoroge is assured of support in advance. What he proposes is in line with legislation the Uganda Government is finding necessary.

Mr. Njoroge has warned that the Government is resolved to deal effectively with thugs who are not only criminal in intent but also in character. They have disgraced Kenya's reputation as a peaceful nation and there can be no doubt President Kenyatta is personally behind Mr. Njoroge's proposals to deal with the ugly situation they have created.

While welcoming this strengthening of the law to deal with armed raiders, and recognizing that the panga is an agricultural implement essential to thousands of workers, it is not possible to look at the possibility of procuring anybody carrying such a dangerous weapon during the hours of darkness. The almost indiscriminate issue of licences to keep firearms for raising the precautions required for their safekeeping, because they would lead to more danger than personal protection. Arms left about, believed to

be lying hand in case of an outdoor race, are liable to be stolen. Moreover, except for the cool and practical jobs, it is remarkably difficult to have even a human figure across the width of an average road, or anybody who has handled a revolver will agree.

The public's complaints that Kenya is a lawless place are not too far from the truth. The panga is a force is no big or too extensive. Such criticism has proved in the recent months, however, has been severely taxed. In such a crisis, the police are for more police, but the force cannot be built up suddenly.

While more manpower is needed to cope with the diversity of police duties throughout the country, mobility is essential because of the more and better vehicles which are being used. The police do not have the resources for their work in detection of law-breakers and protection of the public. Mr. Njoroge's proposals, therefore, are intended to strengthen their hands by giving the courts power to inflict capital punishment for this class of crime.



CHINA

Voting with their feet

The exodus from communist China of refugees fleeing from purges and privations is growing again. Illegal immigration from Hong Kong increased from an estimated 350 in December last year to 500 in January and 600 in February. This has led to a sharp drop in the number of Chinese returning to their native land.

Most of those fleeing from Mao's cultural revolution are coming from Hongkong and a large number are returning to their native land. Many of them are young people who have taken part in the 'Great Leap Forward' and have been severely punished. Some have been sent to the 'back-to-the-mountains' camps and others have been sent to the 'back-to-the-countryside' camps.

EGYPT

Student riots get results

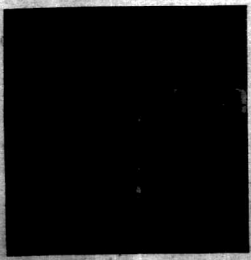

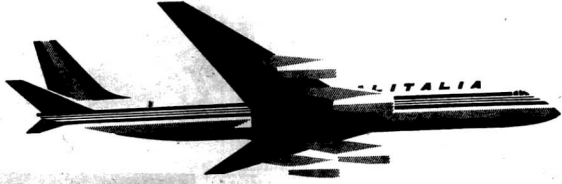

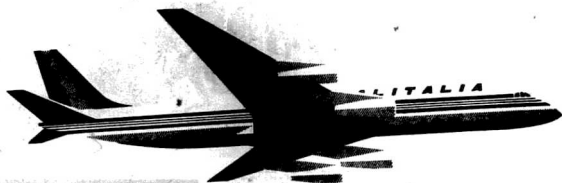

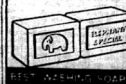

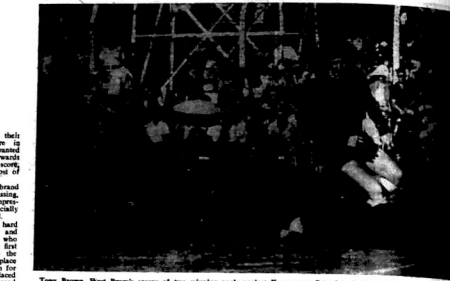
