RUSSIANS LAUNCH ROCKET SPACE STATION

The launching of a third cosmic rocket carrying an automatic interplanetary station to pass near and around the Moon was announced by the Soviet news agency Tass, yesterday.

The launching is part of the Soviet programme for research into atomic space and preparation for interplanetary flights.

It said the station was a spherical object with a satellite stage fixed. The last stage of the rocket was now being sent up. It said the station was now in orbit in the upper atmosphere.

Public enthusiasm for the show had encouraged more and more exhibitors to participate. More than 900 show visitors from 14 different countries were expected to attend. "It would seem in fact, that the Royal Show is something of a success story and that it is having a superb effect," Mr. Seys said.

Wider use of telegrams by phone planned

PLANS to extend the "phone-gram" service—to enable telephone subscribers to send and receive telegrams by phone—are being made by the Post Office. An official spokesman said in Nairobi that the "phone-gram" service would be extended to cover as rapidly as possible so that any subscriber would be able to order a telegram by phone and have the contents of telegram read to him over the phone.

He pointed out that one of the difficulties of maintaining a high telephone facility in the past here has been the fact that he has been an incomplete knowledge of English on the part of some Asian and African telephone operators and the question of proper pronunciation of words.

These difficulties were being overcome, but if the service which will be available after a time will be extended to other parts of the country, it will be necessary to encourage the use of English by operators and to ensure that every word of the telegram is understood.

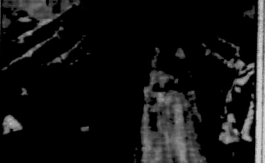

TEA EXPORT OPPORTUNITY

Colony's crop can treble

ALTHOUGH tea is, after coffee, Kenya's most important export crop, the most export of the Colony and Africa amounts to only about 1 per cent of the world's tea exports.

This point is made by the Minister for Agriculture, Mr. M. McKenzie, in a foreword to the first issue of *Tea*, the journal of the Tea Board of Kenya.

The Minister says the average output in Kenya averaged 25,000 tons in 1958 and that in 1959 the output is expected to be 25,000 tons in the same period.

It is estimated that the Colony exports about 25 per cent of all the tea produced in Kenya. Kenya is also the site of one of the largest tea plantations in the world. The Minister predicts that the tea crop in Kenya is likely to triple in the next few years.

The standard average of green teas, including 100 per cent of the best, has been set at 80 per cent of the quality of the best teas, and rapid expansion is expected.

The tea board is of the opinion that the expansion of the tea crop in Kenya is likely to triple in the next few years.

QUESTIONS ON CENTRAL EXPORT ORGANISATION

YOUR report on the annual meeting of the K.C.C. contains the following unquoted paragraph:

EIGHT-STOREY SYMBOL OF INSURANCE

ONE of the finest and most expensively finished buildings in the whole of East Africa, the new Prudential Assurance Building in Nairobi, is to be opened officially to night by the Minister for Commerce and Industry, Mr. Hope-Jones.

The eight-storey building of reconstructed slabs which cost £250,000, combines the clean and graceful lines of modern architecture with functional utility and is designed so that every office—and there are nearly 150 of them—gets the maximum amount of light and air.

A particularly interesting feature is the provision of louvers at the office windows which ensure that the sunlight is evenly distributed throughout each room and yet keep the offices cool.

Their control sun penetration and prevent the entry of direct sunlight into any of the offices.

The extensive use of glass for the show fronts on the ground floor—in particular the BOAC office and the main entry hall to the building—ensures effectively that the building is a glass structure. The BOAC office is the 75-ft-high glass window stretching from the first floor to the top of the buildings on the corners being Eliot Street.

Expensive finish obvious

Above and on either side of the canopy at the main entrance to the building are two mosaic crests designed by an Italian professor and executed under the supervision of the architect in mosaic work (see photograph).

The expensive finish is obvious on entering the foyer where the visitor is confronted by two of the most up-to-date lifts in Africa.

They are described as "almost human" in that they are the latest lift units ever operated on an system which minimises injury for passengers.

For the floor of the main hall, and paneling and doors in many of the offices, the local hardwood, muhihi, has been chosen while all the upper landings are of light-colored wood.

The Prudential's main reception hall, to the right of the foyer, is also paneled in muhihi, giving it a friendly as well as an efficient atmosphere.

Stalls on the ground floor are occupied by Maxwell Brady and Co., Bradley Ltd., Woolfies and BOAC.

The first floor is occupied by the Prudential office, the second floor by Shanyu, Barrett, Kinnon and Marsh, the third floor by A. J. Millar and Son, Ltd., and the other four floors, each with 21 offices, are to be let to various other firms and business concerns.

Unrivalled view of town

The top floor comprises a modern flat for the caretaker of the building—who will have an unrivalled view of the town.

A wide entrance from York Street leads into a spacious car park with provision for pine cars. Garage space will be shared amongst the various tenants.

The car park also functions as a loading bay.

There is little doubt that the building provides a fitting tribute in those concerned in its construction, and to the Prudential Assurance Co. it must be fitting reward for the years of steady endeavour and development in East Africa.

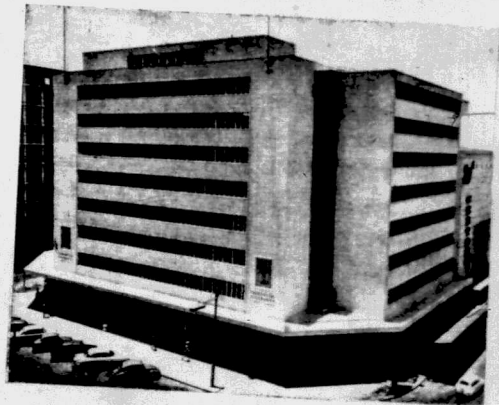

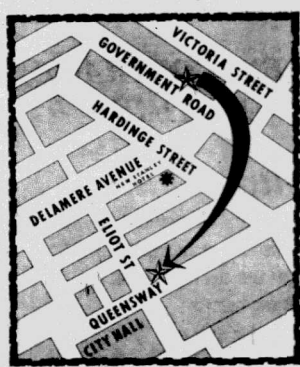

Efficient service created before 1939

STAFF EVACUATION TO PROVINCES

WHEN the Second World War broke out the creation of an economic and efficient insurance service for the masses had been accomplished. Home service of a helpful character had been achieved at comparatively low cost. There was initiative, personal contact, individual strength and financial stability. The company in 1939 was proud of achievement but not satisfied. The aim was to give industrial policy-holders not only home service but benefits comparable with those received by holders of ordinary policies.

Before the war broke out the company had made its plans to meet such an emergency, and on August 25, 1939, the first staff evacuation took place. Centres were established in 11 administrative divisions which would enable complete service to policyholders to be maintained should air attack render London untenable.

The centres were at Luton, Dorchester, Wakefield, Colchester, Cardiff, St. Leonards, Derby, Wigan, Newcastle, South, Worcester and Belfast.

The approved centres, as well as certain other departments, were moved to Luton in London. These divisions only the administrative departments of the ordinary business divisions and a few specialised sections. Executive management remained at their office throughout the war.

Distinguished military record by staff

The fall in interest rates was another circumstance which added to the problems occasioned by the war.

Not was progress lacking in the war years. Although the ordinary branch new business for 1940 showed a decrease over the figure for 1939, new sums assured, including overseas business, amounted to nearly £21,000,000 and in the industrial branch, the premium

income rose to over £25,000,000, an increase of £1,000,000 over 1939. Premiums in the general branch fell by nearly £200,000.

The year 1944 was a record ordinary branch production, new business written during the year amounting to over £17,000,000 some 50 per cent. of which were £100,000 or more written at home.

The total sums assured and bonuses on policies in force in the ordinary branch were £400,000,000 and in the industrial branch over £200,000,000.

Of the sums amounting to £11,817,000 paid in the form of £242,000,000 was invested in British Government and Government guaranteed securities.

Up to the end of the war, the company had subscribed £10,000,000 to war bonds raised in this country and had £2,000,000 more been issued elsewhere within the Commonwealth.

SLIGHT DAMAGE

Some £1,000,000 was paid in respect of war claims, more than half of this amounting to payments on gas-war policies under which a war clause limiting the payment to the value of property would have become effective had not the clause been suspended in operation.

Claims were paid on more than one-third of all the civilian casualties due to air attacks in this country.

While several of the company's provincial offices were damaged or destroyed by enemy action, the chief office

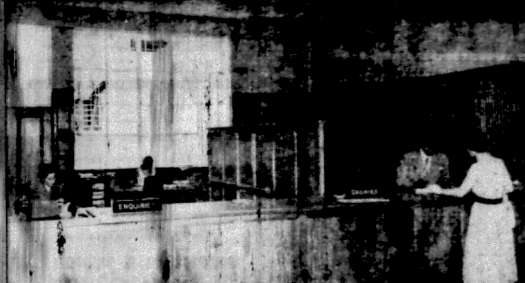

BIG INCREASE IN RATES FOR CIVIL SERVANTS

PROPOSALS which would extend to civil servants the provisions of the new pay scale for Kenya Legislative Council members yesterday when Mr. Ernest Matunga, Minister for the Second Reading of the Evidence (Amendment) Bill.

NEW rates of allowances for civil servants who choose to accept their homes in Kenya instead of going overseas were passed in Legislative Council yesterday. It was reported by Mr. S. The new rates of allowance would be £16 a month for a single person, £18 for his wife and £25, £28 a month for his wife and £25 for each child up to a maximum of two. Maximum allowance for a married man with two or more children would, therefore, be £42 a month, compared with £31 10s a month under the old arrangements.

End of K.E.M. movement ban COUNCIL ALARMED OVER DANGER OF CROWDING

NAIROBI CITY COUNCIL is to inform the Government that its Social Service and Housing Committee views with alarm the probability of gross overcrowding in housing estates as a result of the reopening of roadblocks on an amendment of Kibuye, Embu and Meru.

This decision was taken at a council meeting after a heated debate which lasted for nearly an hour. Mr. Isaac Maina moved an amendment, later defeated, that the council should merely note the decision of the Government and that the council should take no further action.

COMMITTEE TO EXAMINE GRADING

Non-racial basis

THERE was no opposition when Nairobi City Council passed a motion by Mr. K. V. Adaja (East Coast Commercial) calling for a committee to examine grading schemes and salary scales of council employees to make them non-racial.

Dr. Adaja said the elimination of racialism in the salaries and conditions of the employees was made legal by the fast-changing atmosphere of Kenya.

He said he had been told that the salary scales and grades were non-racial at the moment but he could not accept that. Some of the differences were, he said, such as that while African workers were paid as good as those obtaining in Britain, there was no provision for the council of a salary scale for an African official officer.

Leave in U.K.

Other officers were that a European employee was still often paid more than an African in India, but was often paid less than an African who visited Britain. An Asian obtained long leave to visit Kenya and a European employee every five years.

Mr. B. R. Omeri said he would like to see the council employees applied for jobs on the ground of merit and not on race.

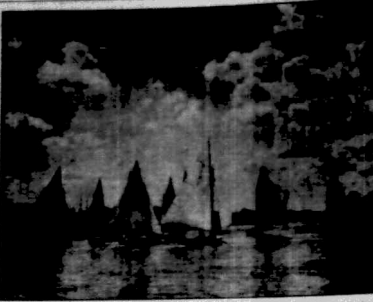

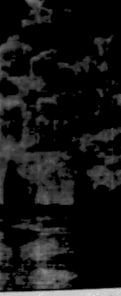

CONSERVATIVES KEEP BANK TO POWER

LOSS OF FAITH IN CRITICS OF COLONIAL POLICIES

SEVERAL of the Labour Party's bitterest critics of Conservative colonial policy suffered at the polls.

Two of them—Mr James Johnson and Mr Arthur Bottomley—had their seats won, others had their majorities drastically reduced.

Liberal Party gains at Labour expense

Mr. Harold Macmillan last night became a Prime Minister with greatly strengthened authority behind him after the British electorate had returned him to power as their choice to lead them to the summit and to prosperity.

His Conservative Party won a resounding victory at the General Election, with its old Parliamentary majority almost doubled. The Labour Party lay in defeat, its policies rejected.

Mr Macmillan, 65-year-old publisher-statesman who has been Prime Minister since an election in 1957, the little St. Anthony Eden resigned as a representative by a strong mandate from the nation.

Political experts studying the result of the election last night claim that these changes are:

- 1—It was won mainly on Britain's current atmosphere of prosperity and well-being under the Conservative Government. Mr. Macmillan's slogan to the people was "You've never had it so good." They seemed to agree with him in the prosperous South of England and the booming industrial Midlands where Labour candidates suffered badly.
- 2—In pockets of the country where people had not had it so good—they voted swing to Labour. This counter-trend was most evident in Lancashire, where the cotton industry is depressed, and in the industrial belt in Scotland which has recently suffered unemployment.
- 3—Overseas issues, apart perhaps from the summit pact, had little influence on the election. Labour's old campaign tried to play the Conservatives with Soviet, Cyprus and Middle East issues. But Conservative supporters were not so easily won.
- 4—The Liberal Party, for long in the doldrums, gained remarkable support—mostly at the expense of Labour—from voters who claim to be climbing back to the role of an effective Opposition which will justify that. But despite this increased poll they still have only five seats in Parliament. They won one seat but lost another.

RESULT PHONED TO CANDIDATES IN JAIL

A special telephone line was set up to enable the Conservative Party to inform its candidates in jail of the result of the election. The party's central office in London phoned the results to the candidates in jail.

RESULT WELCOMED IN FEDERATION

WIDESPREAD overseas comment on the election result generally welcomed the Conservative Party's victory. The Foreign Secretary, Mr. Selwyn Lloyd, said that the result was a very much better than even optimistic expectations.

Main groups

Premier hopes for progress to peace

HOPES that the coming period of Conservative rule would bring happiness to the commonwealth and make some progress towards peace in the world were expressed by Mr. Macmillan when the election result became known.

Speaking to a crowd inside his party headquarters, the Prime Minister said he hoped the country would now settle down and work together with the election battle over in a cooperative government.

SUNNY SIDE UP!

K.S.S. opened its transmission at 8 a.m. yesterday for the first time since the election result was known. The "Sunny Side Up" programme was broadcast.

Liberal predilection

LIBERAL Party leaders predicted yesterday that their party would benefit from the election result.

Increased majority

LABOUR had high hopes of capturing the House of Commons but the Liberal intervention would reduce their majority to 114, which has been reduced to 53.

Kenya is delighted—and indifferent

THE new Conservative Government should be the strongest Britain had had for 14 years and this should benefit a country like Kenya, the leader of the New Kenya Group, Mr. M. Blundell, said yesterday.

More inspectors needed for protection of public

HEALTH SERVICES

Misgiving for future says Nairobi M.O.H.

UNLESS Nairobi's Health Department was provided with more inspectors, the public would be in danger of being deprived of the measure of protection to which it had been accustomed and which was normally expected in a community boasting city status.

This is stated by the Medical Officer of Health, Dr. A. T. G. Thomas, in his annual report for 1958. He points out that reference had been made in 1957 to the urgent need to increase the establishment for health inspectors and it had been hoped there would be some improvement last year.

Stringent restrictions

When the estimates for 1959 were considered it was evident that stringent restrictions were to be placed on the Government's grant for public health, the report goes on. It had become evident that with the department's responsibilities expanding, pressures were building up in essential services which could not be held indefinitely with reasonable efficiency without an increase in staff.

Thomas states that particular notice of the department had been undertaken and it was felt that the limit of 47,000 for 1959 was 70 per cent more than in 1956, and the 1956 figures showed an increase of 40 per cent over 1955. By respecting these limits he could not continue indefinitely on the same basis, he says.

Recalling that in 1951 four European health inspectors were employed to deal with a population of 47,000, Thomas states that general credit was due to the 11 staff members who were responsible for the present population of 220,000. They were doing much to raise the general standard of hygiene and maintain it at a level comparable with that found in cities of much larger administrations.

EGYPT and Sudan have begun talks in Cairo on trade and financial relations and on the long-drawn-out question of distribution of Nile water.

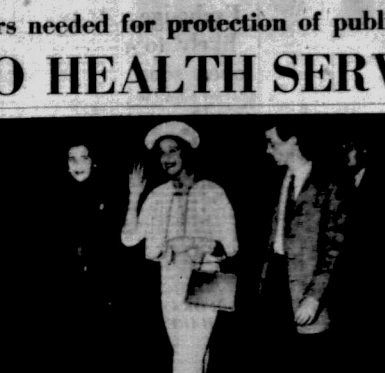
