KENYA RAILWAY STRIKE: 23,000 OUT

Relief teams sent to 60 stations

MOST of Kenya's 23,000 African employees of East African Railways and Harbours obeyed the Railway African Union strike call at the weekend. Passenger and goods trains manned by European and Asian staff continued to operate, but ran late in many cases.

Relief teams were rushed to about 60 stations to ensure that all traffic is handled quickly. An all-out effort by European firemen and electricians at Mombasa and other ports is being made, J. F. C. Williams said.

Messages from the Government and Kenya Railway officials were sent to the strikers.

Loyal staff redeployed

The general manager of E.A.R. said that 1,000 European and Asian staff were redeployed to man the 60 stations.

By using the railway staff who were not striking, the Government is putting up a public, important service against the actions of a group of men.

Their "hard" attitude is what is being opposed by the Government.

An appointment board for the general manager of E.A.R. has been set up to investigate the strike.



U.S. OUTPUT DOWN ATOMIC EYE

National effect of steel strike



A LOSS OF \$100,000,000 (about \$2,140,000,000) in the U.S. and \$100 million national gross output for the third quarter of the year was caused by the nationwide steel strike.

This was reported by the Commerce Department which added that the strike had caused a greater effect than expected.

Steel national output, the third of the year, was estimated to be an annual rate of about 1.7 billion tons for the third quarter.

The Commerce Department said that the steel strike had caused the second quarter of the year to be the first in which the Department's manufacturing index fell below 100.

Increased wage bill for Kenya

Kenya's wage bill in 1956 was a total of K27,300,000 compared with K25,000,000 in the previous year.

The increase was due to a 10% rise in the minimum wage rate from K1.50 to K1.65 per week.

The Government also increased the minimum wage for unskilled workers from K1.20 to K1.35 per week.

The total wage bill for the year was K27,300,000, an increase of 9% on the 1955 figure of K25,000,000.

London market resumes on cautious note

LONDON (E.A.) (S.P.)

The London market resumed on a cautious note today following a period of uncertainty over the future of the sterling.

The pound fell slightly against the dollar, closing at 1.005, and the market was characterized by a general air of conservatism.

There was a slight recovery in the price of gold, which closed at 100.50 per ounce.

The market was also affected by news of the steel strike in the U.S., which caused a fall in the price of steel.

Mr. J. Bikanjira (Bakembesi), who spoke of the need for a choice of colleges being allowed to students who had done well in the primary school, said that freedom might be curtailed if people had to wear in mind that university colleges could not be started just as a sign of nationalisation.

Another Bakembesi Member, Mr. S. W. Kalibwa did not see how Kenya and Tanganyika could afford a university level with a student body of about 100 students each. People from all the four States of East Africa had been looking together at Makerere as one possible and satisfactory avenue of expansion.
Expanding costs on the three university colleges were likely to be very heavy, he forecast. It would be impossible to run the colleges without a grant in aid which would be very difficult to get outside the region.
