SUPPORT of the three East African Governments in guaranteeing an Exchequer loan of £500,000 early next year has been requested by the East African Posts and Telecommunications Administration.

Allsopp sales affected by trade campaign

BIG PROFITS DROP

250,000 off assembly line

THE campaign against beer in Uganda and the attendant trade restrictions was one of the factors which contributed to unfavorable trading conditions during the last financial year, the chairman of Allsopp (East Africa) Ltd., Mr. Michael Blundell, says in his statement to the annual meeting on December 17.

He said that other important factors had been the retarding influence of higher taxation, particularly affecting the African market where there was less of a demand for power and increasing competition, not only from European imports but also from high-quality African brands.

To offset these influences, it had been necessary for the company to open depots in a number of districts throughout the country, through which it was able to achieve more concentrated selling and a better service to the customer.

Mr. Blundell says the increased costs thus incurred could not be expected to improve their full benefit immediately and this had some bearing on the deterioration in the company's profits. He adds, however, that with a change in the nature of the company's own brands and a much closer control of distribution, the expenses should not increase to any great extent.

7 1/2 per cent dividend

Furthermore, with the price of both coal and beer now much lower than for many years, the overall cost of production should remain stable.

The chairman says that in all the operations during the year, his directors feel it prudent to recommend a dividend policy strictly related to the year's performance and in this regard to increase the rate to 7 1/2 per cent, a level which will benefit 250,000 of the shareholders of the company.

PROGRESSIVE POLICY FOR 162 YEARS

By HUGH TAYLOR

IN 1797 a certain Thomas Bignold founded in the city of Norwich the Norwich Union Fire Insurance Society and 11 years later, in 1808, the Norwich Union Life Insurance Society.

The Life Insurance Society was founded on a non-profit basis and from the start any surplus after necessary deductions, was divided among the policy-holders. After seven years of operation, in 1815, the premium income was £48,820 and the total insurances on the books amounted to £873,000.

Although the Fire Society and the Life Society were entirely independent with separate boards of directors, Thomas Bignold was secretary of both and he was followed by his son, Samuel, later Sir Samuel Bignold.

In 1824 the first overseas venture was started with the appointment of an agent in London.

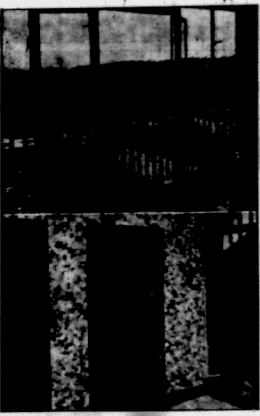
OVERSEAS AGENCIES

In 1844 the Norwich Union acquired the 1860 London Assurance Society which had been founded in 1794 and was the pioneer in a life insurance company in London.

At 1847 took the societies which it acquired to expand its foreign business on the Continent and in 1850 and 1851 acquired the Societies of New Zealand and Australia.

In 1948 the Societies were merged at a conference with a new constitution and the name of Norwich Union Life Insurance Society was adopted.

MORE than 24,500 Penal Code crimes were reported in Kenya last year. Although this was 2,000 fewer than in 1957, the battle against crime is "unrelenting", the Commissioner of Police, Mr. R. C. Collins, states in his annual report published yesterday.

The battle has demanded the employment of every police resource and imposed a heavy strain on all ranks, particularly in the urban areas, he says.

FEWER OFFENCES

At the end of the year it was necessary to increase the number of police in Nairobi, where the incidence of crime was heaviest. Despite effective police action against street gangs and an increase in the assistance given by the public, there was a decline of an estimated 10 per cent in the number of offences reported in the urban areas, and a similar rate in the rural areas.

Mr. Collins says that the 52 per cent reduction in crime compared with 1957, an indication of the aggressive effectiveness of police and preventive methods. The number of Penal Code crimes reported in Nairobi last year, a drop of 2,000 from 24,500 in 1957, was a decrease of 54 per cent from the 54,000 offences reported in the Colony, Kenya and Nyandarua Provinces in 1957.

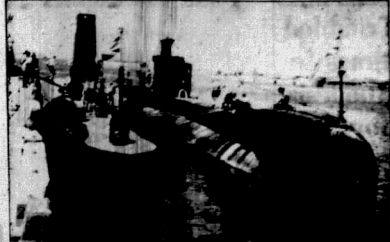

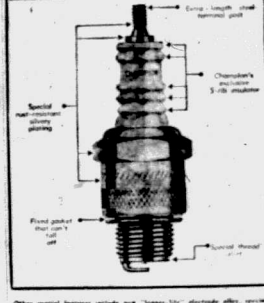

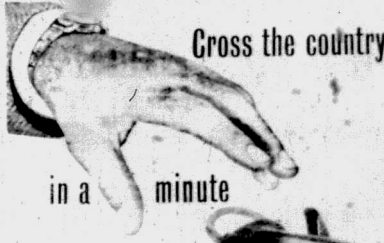

Race policy internal affair for S. Africa

FOR Britain to vote against South Africa's racial policies at the United Nations would be to intervene in the internal affairs of a Commonwealth Government, the Minister of State for Commonwealth Relations, Mr. Albert, said in the House of Commons. This, he added, would be an action contrary to the whole spirit of the Commonwealth.

The motion was defeated by 52 votes to 229 - a Government majority of 177. An amendment by the Government asking the House to approve the Government's efforts to promote racial integration in the Commonwealth was carried by 237 votes to 107.

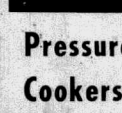

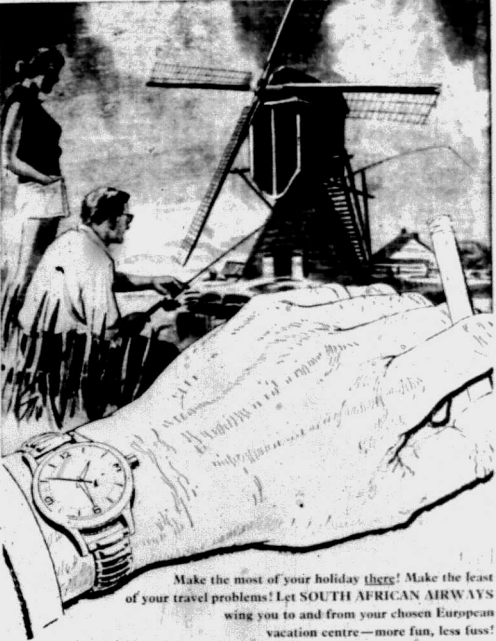

URGENT NEED FOR STEPS TO SAVE KENYA'S GAME

To set Kenya's game preservation agencies on their feet, both the Game Department and the National Parks need £200,000 more than they receive next year reserved expenditure, the Director of the Royal National Parks, Mr. Marwyn Court, told Kenya Legislative Council.

"If that figure was available I believe those agencies responsible for game preservation could really carry out their work successfully," he said. He asked for an assurance that the Government would not be asked to override those of game preservation.

"The details had been sent to the Minister for Game, Mr. Bhat, who asked the House to approve the policy contained in the Sessional Paper."

He said more money must be made available if the Government is to provide for proper maintenance of the game reserves and the game parks caused by poaching.

One recent occurrence suggested that the problem on game might be changing for the better. The Ministry had received an application from Mrs. Mary Abigona (Daghai) which had the effect of having an extra which was transferred to the list of game reserves.
