Instead, on the advice of Congress leaders, it was decided to press for the setting up by the British Government of a commission of experts to recommend constitutional changes.

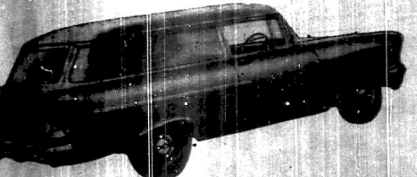



# 153 SUSPECTED ORGANISERS

## OF K.K.M. ARRESTED

### Action to prevent society spreading

#### KIAMBU ACTIVITIES

IT was officially announced yesterday that during the past two days 153 Kikuyu suspected of being the leaders and organisers of K.K.M. — Kiama Kikuyu Movement — have been arrested.

The Government says 89 suspects were taken into custody in the Kiambu area. Arrests in other areas were: Fort Hall, 20; Nakuru District, 11; Matuyza District, four; Malindi, ten; Lelapaia, six; and Nyeri District, four.

The police are now questioning the suspects. The arrests are the result of a long period of investigations by the police and the Administration. The reason given is in conformity with the Government's policy of preventing the development of any threat to the Colony's security.

#### Warning to Kikuyu

Investigations have shown that only a small percentage of the Kikuyu were involved in K.K.M. but a Government spokesman said the authorities were apprehensive that the possible danger of the movement spreading and that the Government would not hesitate to take steps to suppress it.

It is in addition to the action already taken, members of the Administration are continuing to warn Kikuyu in all areas that K.K.M. is a prohibited organisation and that membership of it is committing an offence. On January 18 it was announced that 65 arrests had been made in the Kiambu District.

Further arrests were made in the Nakuru District. Other areas where the authorities are watching are: Fort Hall, 20; Nakuru District, 11; Matuyza District, four; Malindi, ten; Lelapaia, six; and Nyeri District, four.

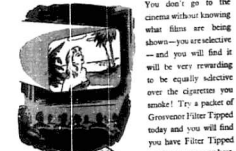

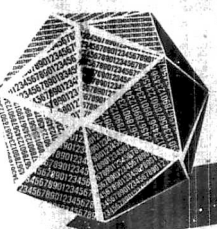
