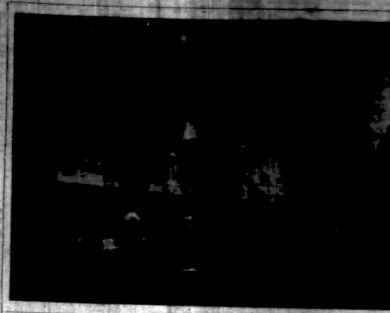

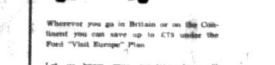

STANDARD BANK 1912

The Eldoret Branch of The Standard Bank opened for business in one room of a mud-and-wattle shack which served also as a Hotel, Bar, Post Office and General Store.  
The life of the staff of the Branch in its early days could scarcely be described as uneventful for, in addition to the reunions celebrated in the bar, the occasional barrage of bottles and then bullets assisted in distracting their attention from their ledgers.  
Concerned over the lack of security over the cash and records of the Branch, a Visiting Inspector insisted on iron bars being fitted over the window which served also as the bank entrance. This was duly done and all was well until a burly customer, impressed by this evidence of progress, decided to test the strength of the bars. One massive tug and away came the bars, the window and a large part of the wall.  
A little later the Branch was provided with a safe and when being unloaded from the ox-wagon it slid down the ramp and fell heavily against the wall, knocking the Bank over. It was then decided to place the safe in position and to rebuild the Bank around it.  
The opening of the Standard Bank in Eldoret enabled the surrounding farmers to use coin and notes as currency instead of Nanyole cheques. These cheques used to progress from drawer to storekeeper, storekeeper to bar, bar to farmer and so on, and it not infrequently happened that the original drawer received all torn and liberally endorsed, his own cheque in payment of a debt. Since then, through good times and bad the Standard Bank has served the farmers and traders of the Plateau. The new and commodious Standard Bank premises, completed and occupied in 1959, now bear witness to the confidence of the bank in the future of the Township and of the District.

The first power station, powered by adapted Garrett turbo-propellers of the type used during the First World War, was known to Eldoret residents as "the bicycle shop" because of the large flywheel on the engine which drove the alternators by a belt system.

It was brought into operation using locally available waste timber. The road was used until 1960 when it became the site of the first street lighting in Eldoret. 24 lamps are strung in rows today there are 251 street lights in the town.

**AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT** is the mainstay of Eldoret's prosperity and an indication of electricity's importance is the fact that two of the largest consumers in the town are a flour mill and a milk-processing plant.

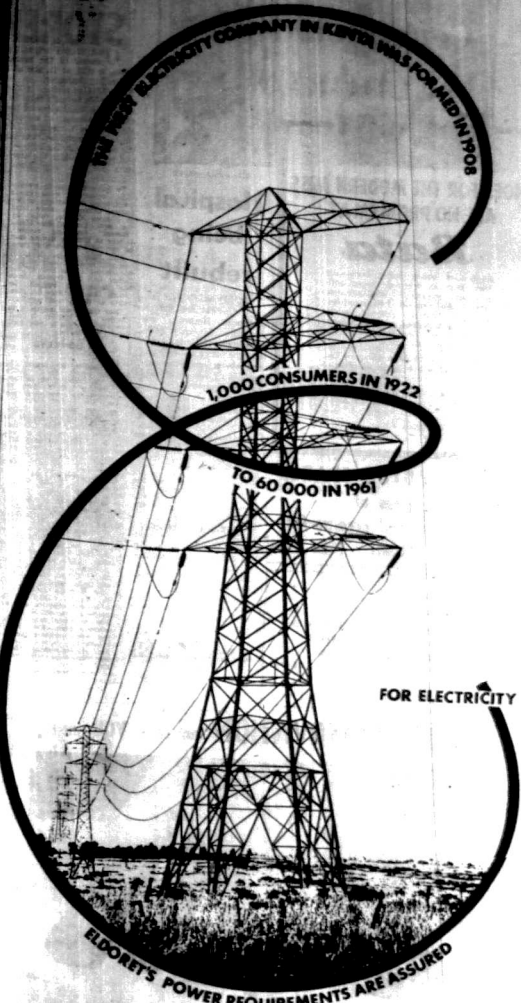

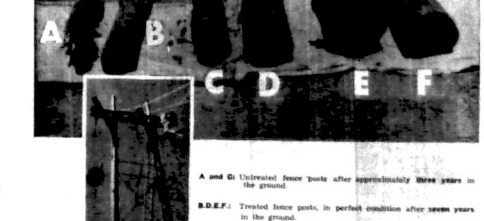

## 1925 RAIL ARRIVAL SOLVED CROP POSER

ALTHOUGH the railway had been completed from Mombasa to Kisumu by December, 1911, its main purpose was to provide communications between the outside world and Uganda.  
There was much controversy about the route of the Uasin Gishu Railway until it was decided finally to build it via Eldoret.  
The main reason for this was that the route via Eldoret was generally three or more feet higher, and when the wagons stuck in a bad bit of road, all those wagons, amounting in all to 27 pairs of oxen, had to be harnessed to one wagon, in paid direct of the mode rule.

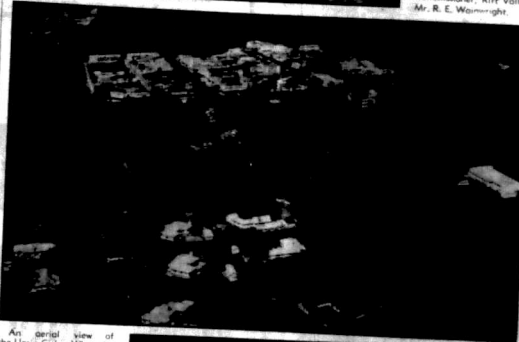

The Commission wishes to bring to the notice of all producers changes in the price and grading rules for Beef and Mutton which have been approved by Government and which were effective on the dates quoted.

### BEEF

Prices — w.e.f. 2/1/62

- (i) Manufacturing 'A' — Shs. 65 per lb.
- (ii) Retained carcasses: The penalty of 5 cents per lb. on carcasses with 1 to 5 mm. cysts has been abolished.

Grading Rules — w.e.f. 6/2/62

- (a) (i) by adding in column (i) thereof, immediately before the specification of Beef — 'First' Grade a new specification as follows —

### 'Baby Beef'

'Baby Beef' shall be derived from steers or maiden heifers which are not more than two inches back irrespective of weight and provided they comply with the specifications for first-grade beef as regards flesh, finish and conformation; and

- (b) in the specification of Beef — 'First' Grade which appears in column (i) thereof by deleting the words 'Carcasses which have not more than two inches back shall be included irrespective of weight provided they comply with the above specifications as regards flesh, finish and conformation'.

- (c) in the specification of 'Standard A' Grade which appears in column (i) thereof — (i) by substituting for the words 'Standard A' Grade beef shall be derived from steers and maiden heifers', the words 'Standard A' Grade beef shall be derived from steers and maiden heifers, or heifers which do not show any pronounced ossification of the spinal process or in the lumbar region'; and

- (ii) by inserting next after the words 'maiden heifers' which appear at the end of that specification the words 'and heifers'.

- (d) in the specification of 'Standard B' Grade which appears in column (i) thereof — (i) by substituting for the words 'Standard B' Grade beef shall be derived from steers or maiden heifers of any age', the words 'Standard B' Grade beef shall be derived from steers and maiden heifers, or heifers of any age', and
- (ii) by inserting next after the words 'maiden heifers' which appear at the end of that specification, the words 'and heifers'.

### MUTTON

Prices — w.e.f. 2/1/62

- (i) Grade 'A' — Shs. 1.60 per lb.
- (ii) Grade 'B' — Shs. .70 per lb.

Grading Rules — w.e.f. 6/2/62

- (a) in the specification of 'A' Grade Mutton, which appears in column (i) thereof by substituting for the words 'This grade includes carcasses weighing under 27 pounds and carcasses slightly lacking in conformation and finish which would otherwise have qualified as "Highland Lamb" or "Lamb Grades" the words "The carcasses and shall include carcasses slightly lacking in conformation and finish which would otherwise have qualified as "Highland Lamb" or "Lamb Grades".'

- (b) By inserting in column (i) thereof, immediately after paragraph 1 of the specifications of Highland Lamb, the following provision —

'Provided that no stock shall be graded as Highland Lamb until the provisions of paragraph 1 hereof unless prior to the sale such stock is marked, for the purposes of identification, in such a manner as may be required in writing by the Kenya Meat Commission. (The system of marking being by ear tags.)

UGANDA NOW SELF-GOVERNING

Thousands at swearing-in ceremony

STANDARD STAFF REPORTER KAMPALA.
UGANDA yesterday attained internal self-governing status. In taking the oath as the country's first Prime Minister, Mr. Benedicto Kiwanuka said the day marked the end of Uganda's struggle against colonialism.
Wearing a tall coat and top hat, Mr. Kiwanuka stood beside the Governor of Uganda, Sir Walter Coultas, as they took the salute at a ceremonial parade of the Uganda Rifles and Uganda Police.
Thousands of people crowded the Parliament Buildings, climbing trees and perching on buildings to watch the proceedings. Sir Walter expressed the hope that Uganda would proceed in the coming months in a peaceful and orderly fashion to a "satisfactory degree of full independence". He added: "Only when this stage has been successfully reached will His Majesty's Government feel that its obligations to the people of Uganda have been properly discharged."

Time for rejoicing

The new premier said: "Today marks the end to a very great extent of the struggle of the African people in this country for freedom. From now on the indigenous people of Uganda will make and implement decisions concerning the internal governance of this country without looking back over the years there was much reason to regret. Many people were in prison for long terms of imprisonment, many died, many at property which they will never recover. Others lost their jobs which resulted in the disintegration of their families. Many suffered physical pain inflicted by the agents of the power against whom we were fighting."

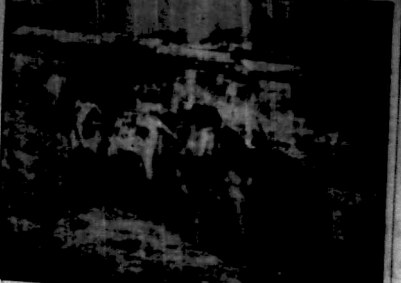




# AT KIPSIGIS LAIBON RETURN

## DEPORTED MEMBERS JOIN TRIBE

The Kipsigis Laibon, banished by the British Government in 1924, are now returning home. The banishment was lifted last year, a member of the tribe has been able to obtain a permit to re-enter the country. 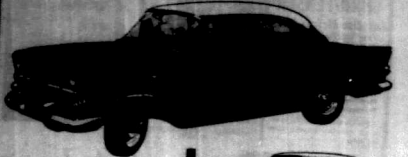

# Cinnamon proves essential to economy of Seychelles

**AFTER a long period of stagnation the crop in Seychelles — providing the main source of income for the islanders — is essential to the Colony's future.**

Introduced into Mahé about 200 years ago cinnamon soon escaped from cultivation and accustomed itself to growing wild. It invaded the hills and mountain slopes where it became deforested and devastated by insects, Martians or Indian Myristic birds, which feed on cinnamon during the fruiting season.

When the vanilla industry collapsed in 1956, the Seychelles Government began to study the possibility of growing cinnamon which was then the most important export crop. The supply of bark was ample, and considerable quantities were being routinely exported by private traders.

It is only eight years ago that all the old trees were cut down and the new trees already had started to grow. The crop is now making the Government's income from the sale of cinnamon bark, which is sold at a price of 20 cents per lb.

From 1915 to 1956 the total production of cinnamon was 100 tons a year. In 1957 the crop was 150 tons, and in 1958 it reached 200 tons.

Export in 1958 amounted to 150 tons, with the arrival of the first consignment of 100 tons in 1959. The value of the country's exports in 1958 was 100 million shillings, and in 1959 it reached 150 million.

It is in fact the ideal crop for the Seychelles because it does not require any special soil, and it can be grown on any of the islands. It is also a hardy plant, and it is not subject to any serious diseases.

The Seychelles Government has already taken steps to encourage the planting of cinnamon trees. It has set up a Cinnamon Planting Scheme, which offers a 50 per cent subsidy on the cost of the trees.

## ELECTRONICS REVOLUTION CREATES NEW INDUSTRIES

**T**HERE is no corner of the world today which cannot be reached by radio.

Stips at sea are constant touch with the shore; aircraft travelling at hundreds of miles an hour several miles above the earth's surface need never be out of contact with weather and position-finding radio stations.

Engineers and those who live in remote and inaccessible places need no longer be out of the rest of the world.

### YOUNG SCIENCE

Electronics is a relatively young science and an ever younger industry. With the exception of radio nearly all the major developments in electronics have taken place in the last 20 or 30 years.

Radio has broken down the barriers of distance by providing direct contact by wireless communication.

Australia in particular had great success in providing wireless communication.

This young nation, with its scattered communications are required to meet an island continent's obvious requirements, was quick to realize the value of the new, swift and economical means of communication.

Perhaps because of Australia's great need for speedy and accurate means of communication, radio and telephony have shown the most rapid advance in solving the problems involved and the revolution of the Australian electronics industry has always been highly judged by world standards.

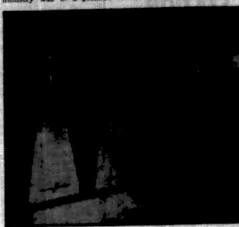
Australia made world radio history when the first direct radio telegraph message transmitted from England to Australia was received in Sydney on September 21, 1914.

This two-page supplement on Australian communication equipment shows how intensive radio and electronics research has created new and expanding industries.

First successful reception of low-power short-wave signals from England was carried out in May of the first year. Australia received the first radio telegraph message from England.

In the early days the use of radio was concentrated chiefly upon its marine applications and in the aftermath of the First World War Australian-made radio telegraph equipment was a valuable aid in identifying the wreckage of many sea-rammed vessels.

Australian equipment was installed in ships built in Japan for the British Government. Therefore, from its beginning, Australia's radio industry was in a position to

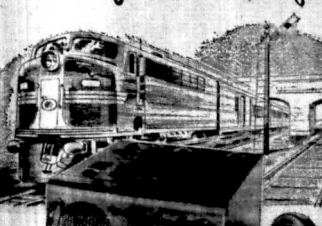
