CANADIAN SEAWAY OPENED

Sirens sound and church bells ring

Royal tour: First picture

THE Queen and President Eisenhower yesterday declared open the St. Lawrence Seaway, which links the heart of North America with the Atlantic Ocean.

At a ceremony attended by 50,000 people the Queen described the seaway as one of the outstanding engineering accomplishments of modern times and a "magnificent monument" to the enduring friendship of Canada and the United States.

Symbol to entire world

President Eisenhower said: "It is a magnificent tribute to the entire world of the achievements possible to democratic nations working together for the common good."

Although the seaway, which cost nearly £100,000,000 to build, has been in use since April, the official opening ceremony was delayed so that the Queen could take part in what was the highlight of her 19.00-mile Canadian tour.

Quise in Royal Yacht

The ceremony was held at Lambert Lock, Montreal, a short distance from the seaway's entrance. After the speech the Royal Yacht Britannia sailed west through the ceremonial arch, signalling the opening of the 2300-mile waterway. Other ships sounded their sirens and church bells rang from the shore.

The Queen and the President then began a five-hour cruise through the seaway, passing on the way a combination of St. Charles and United States Navy ships.

RAPIDLY EXPANDING AND SOUND YOUNG NATION

As the world's largest island, or smallest continent, and one of the fastest-growing nations in the world today, Australia covers a land mass about the same size as the United States.

Yet its total population is still below that of Greater London or Greater New York. Born half a century ago, this country has, however, won its population growth by leaps and bounds since the First World War to reach a total now of about 10,000,000 people. Most of this increase has been by immigrants from Europe. The bulk of the increase has been by those moved round the world from Europe to Australia since 1946, determined to build new lives for themselves. And the movement still goes on.

Australia stands out as a young nation, with a population of 21 per cent under 15 years of age. This is a considerable proportion of the Australian population, due to the work and world-wide reputation of the Australian Immigration Department, under the Immigration Minister, Mr. Alexander Downer.

Almost everyone believes — it is to be hoped a correct guess — about the original target. Almost everyone believes Australia can hold at least 20,000,000 people. Many of the immigrants took 1,000,000 people there during 1958. The average price during the past ten years has been 123,000 people a year.

The bulk, but not the entirety, will come from Britain. Somewhat more than half will come from the countries of Continental Europe, chiefly Germany, Holland and Italy. Since the Second World War, 14,000 people have come from the United States.

Some have been ordinary immigrants, but many have been families of scientists, technologists, American soldiers who married Australian girls, while the American Air Force was here during the war.

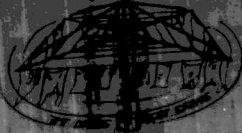

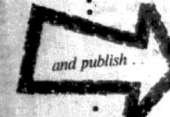

MOTOR VEHICLES A MAJOR INDUSTRY

AUSTRALIA is well on the way to realising a sustained motor-vehicle industry that is self-sufficient in production, and particularly since the war, a major industry. Last year about 340,000 vehicles were imported in Australian market and less than 1,000 of these were produced or assembled in Australia using very few quantities of Australian-made components.

More than half of the vehicles imported into Australia may have a substantial proportion of Australian-made components. The Government's motor-vehicle industry will bring a production capacity reaching 200,000 vehicles a year.

More than 2,000,000 vehicles are imported to Australia which, with four persons in a car, may reach about 10 million in New Zealand among the motorized nations of the world. The United States is first with 24 persons a vehicle and Canada second with 13.

More than 100,000 people are employed in the industry. In other words, the motor-vehicle industry is one of the largest in Australia. It is one of the most important in driving the maintenance and servicing of the vehicle.

THREE STAGES

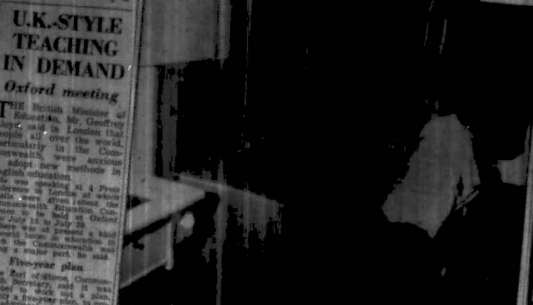

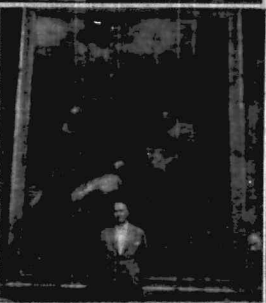

TRIBUTE to the "strenuous work" of members of Britain's Overseas Civil Service was paid by the Colonial Secretary, Mr. Lennox-Boyd, at the annual dinner of the Overseas Club in London.

Reviewing a year of activities in the colonies, Mr. Lennox-Boyd said: "Greatest distinctions are being formed and pass out of our care, but their very existence is the triumphant vindication of our work."

Many difficult tasks confronted colonial civil servants today—harder in many ways than those that confronted their predecessors. In particular, territories in which a number of races made their home "confront us with our most challenging problems."

Unique in history

The Minister added: "You can draw strength and pride in knowledge of the major part you are playing in this task that unique achievement in the eyes of history—the British Commonwealth of Nations."

The phrase "unique" for independence, which had become entrenched in the thinking of many who spoke and wrote about colonial affairs, was in fact a parody of what was really happening.

Britain was in alliance with the colonial peoples in its advance to orderly self-government and in a common cause against poverty, disease and ignorance and against those outside the Commonwealth who sought the destruction of all that had been slowly achieved.

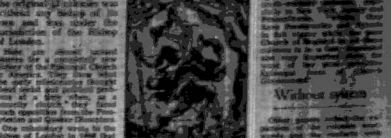

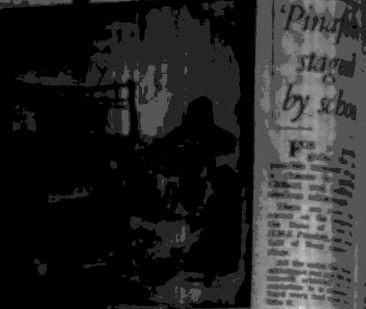

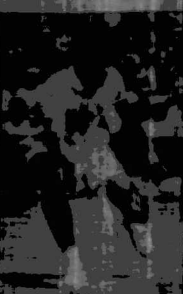
