The body of the late King Albert of the Belgians was finally laid to rest in the Church of Notre Dame at Lieken, amidst impressive ceremonial.

Before the funeral cortege from the Palace at Brussels was formed, 20,000 ex-servicemen paid their final act of homage by filing past the gun-carriage. 18 officers bearing national flags forming a guard of honour.

Following the coffin in the procession were the male members of the Belgian Royal Family, the Prince of Wales, the President of France, and representatives of other European countries.

The ceremony at the Cathedral was conducted by Cardinal Mercier, the Archbishop of Malines, who was an outstanding figure in Belgium during the war, who, following the example of his king, did much to sustain the courage of his countrymen during the dark period of invasion.

It is alleged that there is a marked increase in thefts in Lamu being, it is said, to impede police supervision. Lamu—except European residents—have ever been notorious for their reluctance to lay information, but now that they have been reminded to report of the calling anything to be done without their cooperation it is likely that more may be heard of the matter in the near future.

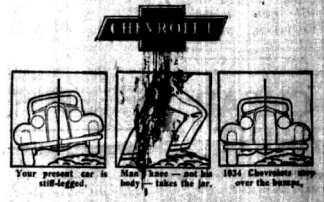

THE SIGNAL INDUSTRY.

To the Editor, "E.A. Standard", Sir—In the reported interview with the Secretary of State for the Colonies it is stated that by the installation of new British decoding machinery the "total saving in cost of production may be anything up to 75 per cent. on present figures."

With a full appreciation of what I have said, that expectation is a merely incredible nonsense. No decoding machinery, British or otherwise, could affect such a miracle and no machinery whatsoever could save any lead to make its highest contents of wire rather than the plant's material requirements alone. Present day controllable production costs are not the problem confronting the industry. These have already been revolutionized and are constantly being made better. The real problem is the self-justifiable for "total saving" if that, shipping freight and charges etc. continue to cost as much if not more as it costs for all labour to produce said wire from the cutting of the lead in the field through all processes to the loading of the baled fibre in a rail-way truck, then every foot of wire that the cost of actual production of a small estate is not the difficulty.

In my experience the price obtainable for years must just return those two costs alone (one of which the "grover cannot" control) and the other things remain. The City of London recognizes the fact that the cost of actual production of wire would welcome a reduction of cheap and cheaper materials and would even bid some capital gain interest, in order to make a profit both ways.

And the Secretary of State for the Colonies agrees with the City of London. Yours etc.

night visit has been made to us and our boys since we came under the jurisdiction of Kilimanjaro, and I would ask that the typewritten slip which is sent to the editor of the Nairobi Standard to leave with one of our employees to be handed to an excellent check on the patrols, and I shall be glad to be informed by you if the police are any longer on duty when the next night visit to our farms takes place.

As to instances, I will give you another instance. On reading the newspaper that reports were being asked to amend the law by prohibiting strange National Guards on their premises, my husband made a request for a round-up of all employed and undesirable natives here, as there was a lot of pilfering going on through our security. It was proceeded, no action was taken by the police. In my previous letter, people have come to be heard are constantly being made aware of any complaints unless of a very grave nature, when all my men are alerted, and it is not reasonable to expect us to make reports twice. If a European estate would pay me a visit, I think I could give him sufficient information to enable an enquiry to be made into these cases of neglect, although unfortunately most of the subsequent judgments of these complaints are now destroyed.

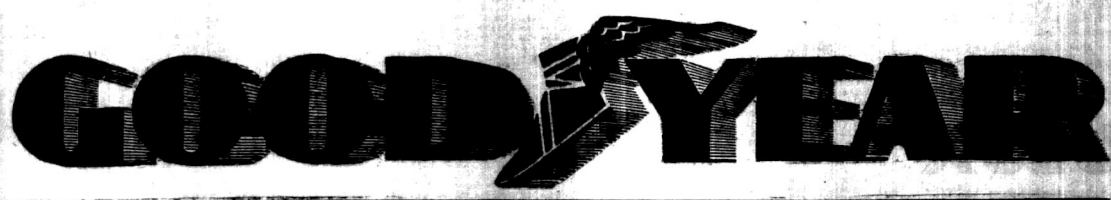

DROUGHT IN MARAGUA DISTRICT.

Grazing Entirely Spoiled Away.

BUT COPPER STILL IN GOOD CONDITION.

Although the Maragua Ridge has experienced no rain since December 16, the prospects of another crop compared themselves on the appearance of their coffee. Naturally standing the constant moisture, but since the coffee has without yielding like as badly as in previous years, though the rest of the country is in a similar state.

NATIVE LABOUR SUPPLY IN SOUTH AFRICA.

Fewer East Coast Boys Employed.

VOLUNTARY SYSTEMS.

The International Labour Office of the League of Nations in their publication 'Industrial and Labour Information' reviews the annual meeting of the Native Recruiting Corporation, held in Johannesburg last year. The Chairman stated that on June 30, the end of the financial year, the native labour force in the service of the gold mines numbered 230,781, comprising 182,728 British South African natives and 47,053 East Coast natives. These figures represented a decrease of 24,000 British South African natives and a decrease of 11,860 East Coast natives as compared with the position on June 30, 1932. In August 1933 the native labour force attained the record total of 232,800.

Economic Conditions. The Chairman pointed out that the depressed economic condition of the natives showed little sign of abatement, and was a continuing factor in urging the natives away from the mines to the labour market. In view of the distress among Union natives, the Government and the Union of South Africa has requested the mining industry to continue the policy of curtailing the recruitment of labour from Portuguese East Africa.

The assisted village system by which the natives could proceed to the mines without being recruited had been permitted under the Mining Convention. The voluntary deferred pay system was adopted by 65 per cent. of the contracted natives as compared with 61 per cent. in 1931-1932. The amount of deferred pay earned by the natives as a result totalled £28,614. The income accruing from the securities in which deferred native wages were invested was estimated by a board equally representative of the Government and of the Native Recruiting Corporation and was applied to the maintenance of approved native institutions and charities.

Embargo Lifted.

The Government of the Union of South Africa has decided to lift the embargo on the employment of the Rand mines of natives from North of latitude 22 deg. S. and has given permission for the importation of 2,000 natives from Bechuanaland, Northern Rhodesia and Southern Rhodesia. In a communication to the Southern Rhodesian Government announcing this decision, the Government of the Union states that it has been definitely assured by its medical advisers that on health and humanitarian grounds there is no longer any justification for the maintenance of the embargo.

NO USE MADE OF POWERS TO RAISE LOANS FOR REDEMPTION PURPOSES.

Although legislation was enacted in the three East African Territories last year to authorize the raising of loans to enable the East African Currency Board to provide funds to meet further redemptions of currency, in the case of Kenya the amount specified was £500,000. It was not found necessary to make use of the powers so given.

This is one of the most interesting facts revealed in the annual report of the Board, extracts from which are given below. For the first time since 1929 there was an increase in the amount of currency in circulation, due in the main to an improved trade balance.

The Report states that no new supplies of coin were required during the year but a supply of ten shilling notes were sent to East Africa. As a means of economy, attempts are being made to prolong the life of notes. Periodical examination of the coinage necessitates the withdrawal from circulation of comparatively few coins.

Condition of the Coinage.

The report of the East African Currency Board for the year ending June 30, 1933, has just been received. The report, which is signed by W. C. Johnston, Governor, and Messrs. P. Reichard and B. N. S. Mwangi, is a most interesting document in relation to the currency in circulation showing an expansion at the end of the year of £1,000,000 in circulation on June 30, 1933, from £9,262,348 on June 30, 1932, and £8,171,648 on June 30, 1932, an increase of £208,322.

MOMBASA MUNICIPAL RE-ORGANISATION.

Increased Efficiency and Economy.

COMBINATION OF POSTS.

Of Town Clerk, Treasurer and Accountant

[STANDARD CORRESPONDENT.]

Mombasa, February 27.—A special meeting of the Municipal Board of Mombasa was held on Tuesday for the purpose of considering the report of the sub-committee appointed to examine the possibilities of effecting economy and an increase of efficiency in the Town Clerk and Accountant's Department.

Following is the text of the report of the sub-committee: "According to its terms of reference, the sub-committee was asked to examine the possibility of effecting a reduction in costs and an increase in efficiency by the consolidation and amalgamation of the Departments and activities now controlled by the Town Clerk and the Accountant respectively and, as a result of such examination, to submit to the General Purposes Committee recommendations as to future working."

Sub-Committee's Report.

The following is the report of the sub-committee: "The Report of the Estimates Sub-Committee under reference in Finance Committee contains the following:—'Some members of the Sub-Committee are of opinion that the activities of the Board as a whole is top-heavy and wasteful and that it can be done by fewer paid clerks if being done by highly paid officials, that the expenses of the Board can be saved by making reductions in the cadre of officials that a start should be made and a scheme explored which will allow the Board to make such reductions in the future.'"

In examination of the terms of reference in the light of the above quotation, the sub-committee is convinced that the attempt to apply major measures of re-organisation in advance of housing all departmental activities being available, not only would be premature but also impossible unless a scheme is devised which will allow the Board to make such reductions in the future."

Town Clerk's Office.

The re-organisation of the Town Clerk's Office and the work of the Town Clerk have been the subject of previous investigation

and the following extracts are quoted from that Report:—

"The Town Clerk cannot reasonably be expected to operate with any degree of efficiency in his present small office which accommodates not only himself but also his typist and his stenographer. His office is a virtually impossible and inter-view with members of the public because matters are not adequately dealt with in a timely manner. The provision of adequate Headquarters for the Municipal staff would obviate this disability."

In addition the sub-committee is forced to the conclusion that the Town Clerk has not hitherto given sufficient attention to the essential priority of the duties specified by Standing Orders of other departments from the point of view of Municipal Administration as well as equal importance for the successful working of the Town Clerk's Department in connection with the Town Clerk's Office. It is recommended that the duties specified by Standing Orders of other departments should be taken over by the Town Clerk and Treasurer at the same time it is felt that over-contraction of the responsibilities is unwise and that each Departmental Head should be entrusted with the responsibilities proper to his appointment. The Town Clerk, concentrating his attention on general co-ordination and the fulfilment of the duties specified in Standing Orders."

Re-organisation.

Investigation leads the Sub-Committee to believe that given the feasibility of a central office the following re-organisation, more in keeping with the funds available to run the Municipal machine, can be introduced:—

- (1) Municipal Board (2) Town Clerk and Treasurer and Assistant (3) Medical Officer (4) Municipal Engineer (5) Municipal Surveyor and Assistant (1) to (5) Clerical duties corresponding to sitting, etc. to be pooled and powers of delegation in the conduct of technical and routine correspondence by Departmental Heads to be applied to the fullest possible extent.

(3) to (5) Committee work in preparation of Minutes, etc. for the Health, Works and Town Planning Committees to be arranged for by the appropriate Departmental Heads.

After full investigation and consideration of the merits of the views expressed the Sub-Committee feels compelled to recommend that constitutional action should be taken to effect the re-organisation of the Town Clerk and Treasurer's Office now occupying the post of Town Clerk and Treasurer and that the expiration of the lease of this office, such appointment should be offered to the holder on the salary scale approved by the Board for the post of Town Clerk and Town Treasurer by the present incumbent of the post of Accountant.

ENGLAND'S WIN AT DUBLIN.

Irish Backs Fail Badly. Forwards Bear the Brunt.

A Mixture of Good and Bad.

STANDARD CORRESPONDENT. London, February 18. England beat Ireland at Dublin on Saturday, by two goals and a try to a try, and deserved the win by that margin.

It was not particularly sparkling match-in fact, it was at its extremely dull, but had its bright patches, and that things were really exciting. England won mainly because they were much cleverer in their combined play behind the scrum, and because the forwards were at least as good as their opponents in the tight scrums that the whole side showed.

England only made two changes in the team which beat Wales (Football) and the Royal Navy (rugby) and Western Province (rugby) Ireland, injured, had several of their forwards untried, and unable to try.

The weather was bright and the ground in good order.

A TIE GAME.

England had a tie-off in the second minute in the game when they were penalized in front of goal on the twenty-five line and Sigurdson missed an easy kick. They did not profit long from this escape. Morgan, with the game five minutes old, slipping round the blind side and selling two dummies to score. Although there was no goal, that was the kind of early score which might affect the result of any match. In the tenth minute a drop at full-back curbed just outside but not managed an attack. The break followed by Coore, and a flank dash the night, wing by O'Connor, reserved Ireland's advantage, and a place kick from a mark by W. Miller, and sound touch, finishing by Pratt placed England in a position which was really a slight advantage to them were particularly welcome. Davy catching Eildon's short pass and kicking straight on to the left wing, again put Ireland on the offensive, a position in which Ross's clever covering work kept them when England tried to break away.

In the thirtieth minute England got a footing, their second only in Ireland's 25, and a corner. Dublin forwards by Coore and W. Miller, the latter getting a good try. Mickle missed the kick, but the English backs were more successful. Ireland, finding getting offends in their own 25, Mickle had a good chance of getting a try, but he failed. The next morning, however, Ireland started a run halfway, and after Forster and Eildon had handled, and Coore converted. A drop at full-back, by Davy which went wide, and a dangerous interception by Dublin's good Irish forward, and a first half which had worked up from

slow and dull to fast and thrilling Rugby.

Exciting Second Half Phases.

The second half, England re-started with great assurance, and Davy had to mark near the line from a move by Coore and Ward. A series of free kicks for scrumming infringements by both sides broke up the rhythm of the game, and when, after Ireland's long and quietest head of the match, when Warr was sent away down the right wing, the whole went for a breakdown. Eventually Ireland began to get the better and an accurate kick by Mickle saved an awkward situation, but England brought back, and passing in which forwards and backs took part, nearly won Warr over for out on the right 15, though England were missing for the most part, they needed at least one more score to make the game dead. A long kick by Eildon sent the Irish back from a short attack and then came a great break through in Coore's hands, running to the other end, he got a few yards from the line, and then an Irish full, and Morgan hurried forward, only to pass to Warr and a little later try took place on the other half. Warr's kick through Time was getting short, if Ireland had been showing their late half, half through a penalty kick, England's 25 was taken by Sigurdson with no useful result, and England took play down to the other end, where Eildon beat Davy and hung a long pass to Mickle, who however hit was inaccurate and scored a try for a try, which Henry converted. The situation settled the issue, and the remaining few minutes' play had little bearing on the match.

The Irish Team.

Ireland's backs led their side down badly, and to the weakness behind the scrum may be attributed their defeat. Never has Ireland been better served by their forwards, and by each mark to be described as eight hours, fighting an impossible battle. The one doubt was their stamina, but they lasted out a gruelling game magnificently, and were going as strongly as the first whistle as in the final quarter of an hour which their tremendous work in the loose should have yielded at least three scores.

England's forwards were plenty fit for the job but one part with H. it was more of a nuisance than an advantage to Ireland. Davy was uncertain how much to show, Ireland's scrum was a weak point in his method, while McMahon was little better than a spectator.

The English Team.

Owen-Smith could claim the credit of setting up an attack which gave Ireland a score, and the setting of badly-needed conditions in their power, but well though he fielded and kicked on occasion, he was quite more than one of the best players who are not certainly necessary to beat a man before he is fit to be a member of the second half of a player with a fine which might place him in the list of great full-backs. The match was a whole, was a mixture of good and bad, and led the forward, and the holder, as at Cardiff, with the impression that England were not a good team which had not played at the best, or of a very average side for whom things happened to them. The Calcutta Cup should not be given to England.

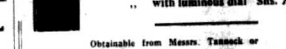

For one thing it seems to me that the most important factor for the British Government to be hanging about what duties shall or shall not be levied in different parts of the Empire. Then again the arrangements entered into in India are most unsatisfactory for the cotton goods is limited, the quantity is based on a much higher level than that of two or three years back, and in addition the duty is reduced from 75 to 50 per cent. 50 per cent. may seem a high duty but it is a comparatively light burden on the selected types of Japanese goods. There is also another most unsatisfactory point. The goods does not apply to goods made of artificial silk, nor I believe to mixtures of cotton and rayon. Therefore it seems probable that cotton goods containing even one or two per cent. of rayon can be shipped to India in unlimited quantities. In any case there is no limit to the quantity of dyed or printed goods made entirely of artificial silk, and these can be produced in Japan just as cheaply as cotton goods.

The connection it is rather remarkable that since this agreement was made my firm have done previously no new business with India, and my firm & sell me that is the same with them. Further the Japanese are very clever and crafty people and judging by what has happened in India our Government is no match for them in this respect.

A Misleading Statement.
"I should like to draw your attention to a leading article in 'The Times' of January 26, which, judging from a recent speech made by Mr. Rathbone, seems to have been inspired by the Government. I only noticed the article because it dealt with the cotton trade. The main point of the article is that the Government's policy is to give Japan a success as long as it gives labour and a depreciation of the Government's main money. This is a fair stand against what has been properly termed the 'Yellow Peril' then we can hope again. But if on the other hand they say that they are doing nothing then I regard the future as almost hopeless, and the best advice I can offer to everyone engaged in the Report Trade is to wind up your business, close out and save what you can out of the wreck."
