Emergency in Detroit after racial riots

Some people dead, damage estimated at \$35,700,000, and 7,000 law-abiding citizens prepared yesterday to move to enforce the peace in Detroit quelled after racial riots, described by the Rev. Charles Quinn as "the most destructive in America's history since the days of Emancipation."

Sporadic gunfire still cracked through the shocked city as police strove to contain rioting, sniping and looting. A 23-year-old white woman, a Negro sniper and a Negro looter died when the riots were at their height. Many hundreds were injured.

Michigan's Governor George Romney earlier asked for a division of 5,000 troops of the U.S. Fifth Army, based in Chicago, but later withdrew the request. The troops were needed elsewhere in the country. New York (New Jersey), New Britain (Connecticut), Birmingham (Alabama) and Rochester (New York) have all been hit by racial disturbances in the past 24 hours.

At dawn yesterday riots were still raging in Detroit. More than 3,000 people have been arrested, and police closed all petrol stations in the city — America's car capital — because motorists were using the petrol to start fires. It was reported that 206 fires had been started.

Tanks join city patrols

A tunnel and a bridge linking the city to Canada across the Detroit River was sealed off, the streets were littered with rubble from gutted buildings, looted shops and wreckage of burnt-out cars.

About 1,500 National Guardsmen, reinforcing 600 city police, brought in two tanks when the guns sealed to prevent any form of provocative shield against sniper fire.

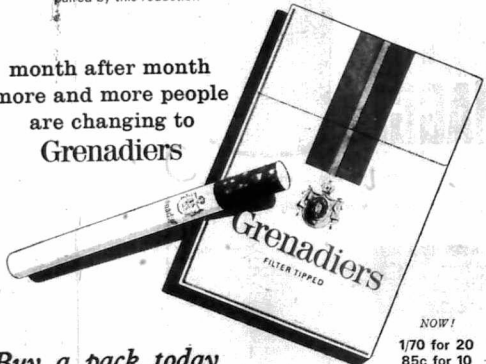

Plans to limit land purchase to citizens

BRITISH DIPLOMATS IN KENYA DEFENDED

CHARGES that the British High Commission in Nairobi was neglecting the interests of the British community in Kenya were angrily rejected by the Commonwealth Secretary of State, Mr. George Thomas, during a debate in the House of Commons yesterday.
