## FINANCIAL TALKS IN LONDON

*Kenya deputation returns*

**AGREED IN PRINCIPLE TO FLOAT  
LOAN LATE NEXT YEAR**

Kenya's Chief Secretary Mr. J. D. Rankine, and the Member for Feinstein Mr. V. G. Matthews, have just returned to Kenya from London. It is understood that these talks were held under the following circumstances:

(a) the allocation of defence expenditure and  
(b) the amount of loan to finance Kenya's development programme.

With regard to defence expenditure, East Africa has agreed that this will be the subject of further negotiations. At present official representatives of the Ministry of Defence, the Treasury, the Colonial Office and the African Ministers' Conference are discussing the division between H.M. Government and the Colonial Governments of money available for defence. It is reported that the Conference accepted certain recommendations made over by the Ministry's Government.

### Loaders stole gold bars from aircraft

Six leaders of British Overseas Corporation were sent to prison at Caxton Hall, London, for stealing gold worth £3,500 at London Airport.

The prosecution said that the gold was being kept in an armoured van which had been hired by a Harry Smith, 32, to transport a load of equipment on a lorry and that the gold was to be sent by air to a gunsmith in a private house. A few days later, one of the men, a Mr. Brown, was caught returning £3,000 for the gold.

#### The sentences

Three of the men were also found to have stolen other articles from abroad.

One of the six men was sentenced to three years imprisonment. The others were given 12 months, suspended for two years.

Mr. Smith charged with receiving the gold was given three months in custody. Two other men were given six months each.

Mr. Smith was given a fine of £100.



**PLAYING** crisp, clever foot-hold and always the better side—North Nyanza (holders) final since 1933 by beating Nakuru three-nil at the African Sports Club on Saturday afternoon, before a crowd estimated at around 10,000 marks. The visitors were outplayed but not disgraced.

During the first half, Nakuru made a determined effort to be the "victors" but never relaxed their grip on the ball.

**Magnificent halves**

The winners owed their victory largely to the excellent play of their half-backs. They never gave Nakuru's forwards a chance to get away and their own backs well paid with the ball. The visitors' defence was of course of play from first to last.

After the first half North Nyanza were very well served by the referee, who was lenient with the inside-left, Omati Okano, and a shrewd referee who should have automatic choice for George's Garage.

The winners' defence was invariably excellent.

For Nakuru, their centre-forward,

and all along the line, was patient and always dangerous when in possession.

He missed a point-blank sitter in the first minute of the second half but his team-mates were quick to make up for it with a series of attacks.

North Nyanza kept a pointed attack and were well served by their design. He was always a tiger and would have been battered by goal or even two.

The weather was cool and tricky wind prevailed.

It was a hard-fought battle and Nakuru's fast break was fairly frequent. But when North Nyanza had the ball, they were always on the ground their footwork and pattern-walking was superb.

KENYA's gold production for September was the lowest of any month this year, recovered from a dip in August, and output is expected to rise in October.

So far, a Mines' official said yesterday, the Government's ownership of production had resulted in a reduction of gold output.

At the end of September, the Mines' department produced a great deal of gold, but it was not possible to exact the total output due to the extent of nearly 600 unrecorded outlets for small-scale production for the month.
