For the most part there are also well developed
 sports. Football is naturally the comparable

 the following in the space of an hour.
 Well, as a man, not forget the trout fishing which
 has become a very important item in the recreation
 of the colony, the export of 150,000 trout
 having been made in Great Britain. In the prin-
 cipal rivers in the colony, there is sport.

The colony is ideally placed for people who have
 retired from business with a moderate income; the
 climate is such which they wish to enjoy in the
 sun, and yet with the assurance of a good life
 about them. There is no income tax in Kenya, and
 since all taxation save a small property tax is indirect,
 a person who is prepared to live mainly on the pro-
 ducts of the colony can support himself in the com-
 fort of an English home surrounded by his own
 people far more cheaply than ever in England or the
 United States.

Near Nairobi land is generally more expensive and
 so are building costs. Some Native servants com-
 mand high wages, but only in the closer settled
 parts of the country districts it is possible to procure
 thirty or forty acres on a small river at a cost in-
 cluding building a house and making a garden, not
 in excess of a similar scale of residence in the rural
 districts of England. One can have a fine house fitted
 with every amenity and convenience known and in many
 times, the local furniture manufacturers being first
 class, and the local timbers very beautiful and well
 adapted for panelling or for furniture. Moreover,
 when you first arrive to live in Kenya you can buy
 with you any of your personal belongings, which
 with very few exceptions will be cleared through
 the Customs free, provided that they are your per-
 sonal property and are not imported for sale in the
 colony. This includes household furniture, and other
 effects.

Having done this, it is possible to live a very
 comfortable standing of comfort at a rate not com-
 parable to that in England. There are no rates and
 taxes, so that you can live about a year, which
 have servants, boys, and maids in the towns can be
 had for 50s. and 100s. a month. These boys can be
 trained into capable servants, whether they be
 house boys, gardeners or chauffeurs; ample staff for
 a family of four people is a cook and kitchen boy,
 two house boys and two gardeners at a total cost

£100 a month including laundry, household fuel,
 and cleaning and oiling.

A man who makes his home in Kenya but who
 has no ambition to farm can put up a pleasant
 day in this sunny climate, tending his lawns and
 his garden, which will provide him with all the fruit,
 vegetables and flowers he can use, if he has the
 ability to supervise his own garden.

Kenya Gardens

Gardening is one of the chief joys of life in Kenya,
 and the gardens must be seen to be believed. It is
 surprising to hear any country possesses garden pos-
 sibilities such as Kenya. Apart from the tropical
 and sub-tropical flowers one can grow all the English
 bulb, such as tulips, lily of the valley and delphiniums,
 in fact, all the annuals and perennials of an English
 garden, while it is not an uncommon thing to see
 the garden, the violet, the rose and the pansy all
 thriving in the same bed. Results can be obtained
 in a Kenya garden in eighteen months which would
 take years to achieve in England.

Afternoon can play a game of tennis in the after-
 noon, shoot an occasional buck and in the
 evening play a game of bridge; and at week-ends
 in the sports clubs and these exist everywhere, will



NORTH CHARTERLAND INQUIRY

The directors of the North Charterland Exploration Co. (1928) Ltd., have received a letter of reference and confirmation of the promised public inquiry into the question of land comprised in the company's concession in Northern Rhodesia which has been expropriated for Native Reserves without compensation. The terms of the company states, 'are of a character such, in the opinion of the directors and their legal advisers, renders them unacceptable. Detailed protest and reply has accordingly been sent to the Colonial Office, whose answer is now awaited. The report and accounts are ready, and in the ordinary course these would now be issued and annual meeting convened. In the circumstances the directors deem it wise to postpone the meeting until the outcome of the correspondence with the Colonial Office can be communicated to shareholders.'


