Mr. R. Abel-Smith's Statement

THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING of Dalgaty and Company Limited, will be held on December 6/7 in London.

The following is a extract from the circulated review of the chairman, Mr. R. thing to be desired, but only in comparison with recent years and they will represent a useful contribution to the overall net profit.

East African Merchandise

"The East African merchandise result proceeds from a year in which can be said to have recovered over the past two years, and should be assisted in future by a considerable easing of the long-standing difficulties in arrangement of our merchandise to go to Mombasa, through which pour the bulk of our imports into East Africa must pass. The slack season has now been unsatisfactory, and the Department has again produced a favourable result. Our Land Agency business continues to be hampered by the 'credit crunch' but nevertheless a useful adjunct to our other activities.

Dealing so largely with the primary producer, there may be fluctuations in earnings from time to time caused either by weather conditions or changes in the prices of primary products, but in the immediate outlook, coupled with the general rise in the level of wool prices, is quite promising.


