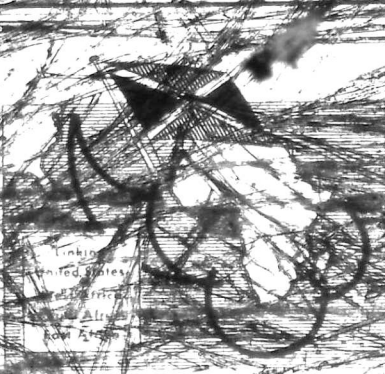

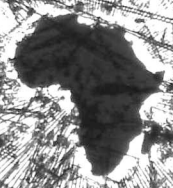

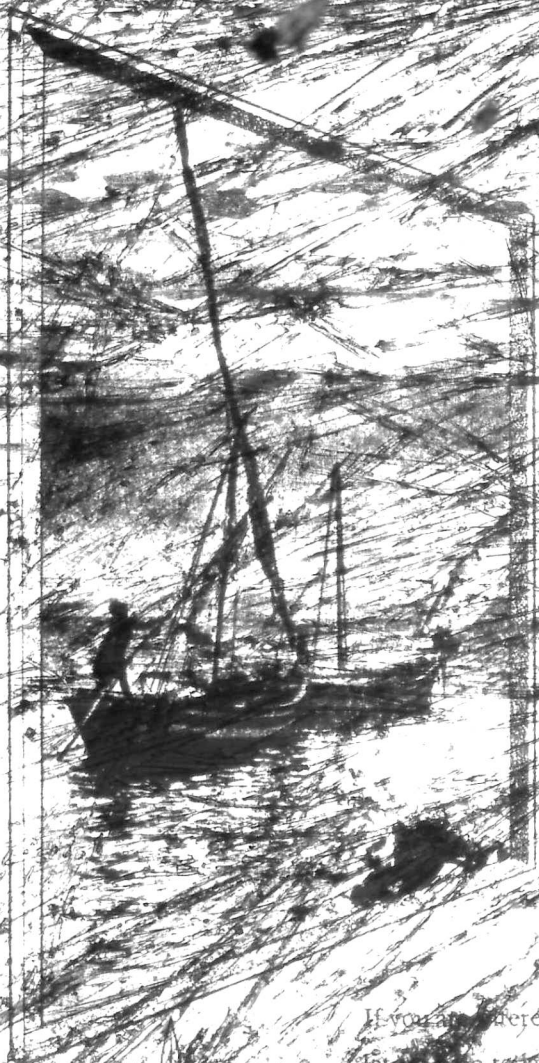

### Of Commercial Concern

At the week's end in London, 12,000 cases of coffee were sold, a 10 per cent increase on the 11,000 cases sold in the week ending October 23, compared with 11,476 packages in the 11 weeks of the previous week. thing to be desired, but only in comparison with recent years and they will represent a useful contribution to the overall net profit.

East African Merchandise

"The East African merchandise result proceeds from a year in which can be said to have been the best of the past two years, and should be assisted in future by a considerable easing of the long-standing difficulties in arrangement of the merchandise of our goods to Mombasa, through which pour the bulk of our imports into East Africa must pass. 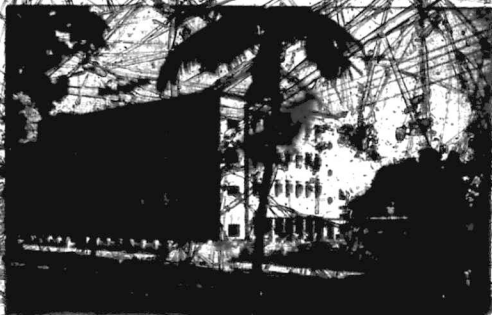
