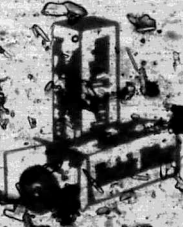

NYASALAND TRADE IN 1927

British Imports Steadily Falling

The depression in the market for primary products which lasted throughout the year 1927, has generally affected both the imports and exports of the Nyasaland Protectorate (Annual Report of the External Trade of Nyasaland, Government Printer, Zomba, 1928). It did not have appreciable results reflected favourably on the country's resources, which was an exceptional year, but compared with other times the trade of Nyasaland makes a marked progress.
