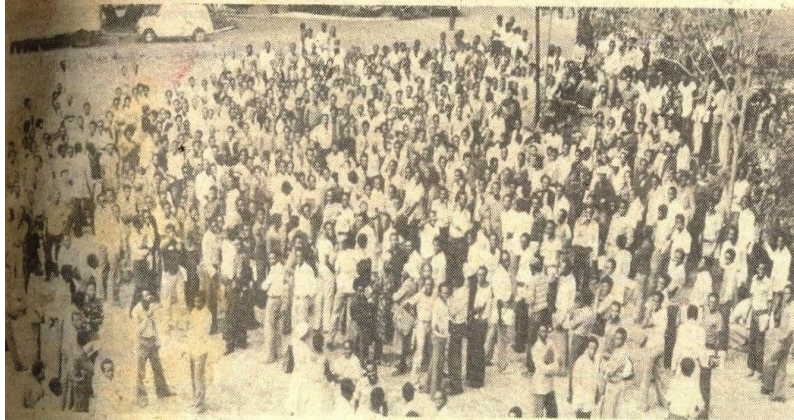


Students mob varsity dean

SCIENCE students of Nairobi University yesterday forced their dean to draft a letter revoking some examination results released on Monday.

Earlier, the dean, Prof. G. K. Kinoti, admitted some irregularities in the marking of the results. However, he drafted a letter surrounded by irate students at Chiromo campus; the protestors refused to accept it, saying it was too vague.

The draft said: "The Faculty Board of Examiners has decided to recommend that the provisional examination results announced early in December 1981 stand." Prof. Kinoti said the letter, in effect, nullified some other results released on Monday.

But the students drafted another letter for him to sign. Prof. Kinoti said he could not sign it without the authority of Vice-Chancellor Joseph Maina Mungai.

The argument between the students and the dean lasted for nearly three hours in the presence of Deputy Vice-Chancellor Philip Mbiithi.

And when Prof. Kinoti still refused to give in the students marched him to the main campus to see Prof. Mungai.
