The interactive and informative workshop included presentations made by senior researchers from Tanzania, Uganda, Kenya, Ethiopia, South Africa, Nigeria, Zimbabwe, U.S.A. Francis Njiri made a presentation on *'What the institutional leadership needs to do to increase research quality and quantity at institutions.'* At the end of the workshop, the three representatives were awarded with certificates for their active participation during the workshop. The workshop presented an opportunity for the university of Nairobi representatives to share the UoN's experiences in supporting research administration and benefit from experiences shared by other institutions.
