

Geography & Environmental Studies Annual Field Class

The BA III 2014 field-class took place in Rift Valley, Nyanza and Western regions of Kenya between 2nd and 8th November, 2014. The theme of the field-class was **“Prospects and challenges for socio-economic development”**.
