- a. Describe indications, contraindications, efficacy, and safety profiles for KEPI and non KEPI vaccines
- b. Describe good immunization practices
- c. Administer selected vaccines
- d. Recognize policy, legal, attitudinal and other barriers contributing to sub-optimal vaccination rates
- e. Develop strategies to increase vaccination rates and identify best practices for implementing or improving immunization programs in specific practice settings.
