Ngong water shed through planting of indigenous species especially those have multiple values. The two species were specifically selected by the community because of their medinal value.

They expressed their wish that in future they will get further support in the conservation of the riparian land along the Kiserian river where farmers have indicated their willingness to set aside 30 meters on each side of the river for conservation purposes.
