Expanding choices beyond sex work

RUIRI HOPE CBO – MERU

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Introduction

- The University of Nairobi CHIVPR CDC funded MARPs project is providing a comprehensive HIV package for KPs in 10 DICEs including Meru DICE since 2011.
- The package includes biomedical, behavioural and structural components. The structural component was later strengthened to give the peer-led groups some income generating activities to expand their choices beyond sex work.
- The purpose of initiating choices beyond sex work was to reduce their heavy dependence on commercial sex and the risk of HIV infection or re-infections for those already infected.

Design

- Formation of peer-led groups with leadership structures
- Follow-up of clients on care to ensure adherence
- Peer education on PHDP messages at least 2 messages per meeting
- Recruiting and training peer leaders
- Expanding choices beyond sex work

Background information about Ruiri Group

 Ruiri Hope is one of the well developed groups on Income Generating Activities (IGAs). It was initially formed as a large group of mixed open cohort known as Bandilisha - for behaviour change. Later those who tested HIV positive formed their own PHDP group known as Ruiri hope and registered with the mandated government ministry in November 2011 as a CBO. The reason for separate registration was to protect the confidentiality of PLHIV MARPs. It has a membership of 37 FSWs. All group members are living with HIV.

Objectives

The objectives are to:

- Provide leadership in HIV prevention, treatment and care through a peer-led system.
- Stimulate a hypnotic positive peer pressure in saying "no to unprotected sex" and other risky behaviours.
- Expand choices beyond sex work.
- Insist on 100% condom use.
- Mitigate and manage sexual Violence.
- Manage rape and condom burst to prevent reinfections, STI and pregnancy
- Encourage them to live positively with AIDS

Objectives Cont.

- Strengthen Positive Health Dignity Prevention activities in the area using the national guidelines (13 PWP messages)
- Reduce HIV Stigma for all PLHIV
- Inspire Hope for all members through education, experience sharing and economic empowerment.

Ruiri group HIV related activities

Health education for members on:

- ✓ Appropriate nutrition
- ✓ STI prevention
- ✓ Re- infection prevention through PHDP activities
- ✓ HIV testing and re-testing for children below 15Years and partners
- ✓ Drug adherence
- ✓ Disclosure to partners
- ✓ Reproductive health including dual family planning
- ✓ Condom demonstration, negotiation and use
- ✓ Home visits and follow-up for those on ART

Methods of gathering the data

- Peer leaders reports
- Group minutes
- Observations
- Self reports

Reasons given for not using the condoms always before joining the IGAs activities

- "Some clients' doubled the payment if it was *nyama Kwa nyama* (without condom) and I didn't have any other source of income".
- "Sex with a regular partner"
- "Fear of my children and myself sleeping hungry"
- "Sometimes I was very drunk and unable to insist on condom use".

Ruiri Hope group development

- The group has evolved from a simple HIV support group with Zero savings to Ksh 500,000.
- The group is now able to provide up to Ksh 20,000 loan for members and non-members.
- The group has a bank Account at Family bank.

- Members contributions
- Merry- go- round
- Table banking
- Loan interests from both members and nonmembers
- Beadwork, soap making and other detergents
- Poultry and dairy goat rearing
- Government loans women enterprise fund now paying back Ksh 100,000 from women enterprise fund at 3 %

- Has benefited from Ksh 130, 000 from Uwezo fund -cheque delivered in early December 2014 by area Member of Parliament and County women representative
- A Posho mill worth Ksh 150,000 donated by a partner FHK awaiting installation by the group, they also require a 3 phase electrical line.

- Reduced dependency on sex work and number of sex partners
- 100 % condom use- through self reports
- No STI reported for anyone for the last one year in this group
- Some of the group members have confessed complete abandonment of sex work and adoption to alternative livelihood (IGA)

- Abandonment of changaa brewing, intake and increased adherence to medication with no lost to follow
- Improved quality of life and self esteem
- Able to educate their children who remain in school

- "I have money now and there is no fear of not being able to pay my house rent, sleeping hungry or losing a client".
- "I can survive without sex work now".
- "I use condom always with all clients and I have no fear of getting STI or getting unintended pregnancy".
- "I suspect those who want to double payment and persuades me not to use condom wants to re-infect me" and so, I only offer services to clients willing to use condom".

Conclusion

- We have shared with you about one of our peer-led approach in HIV prevention and management
- Ruiri hope group is one of the four PLHIV FSWs groups in Meru MARPs project
- IGAs or expanding choices beyond sex work reduces the risk of STIs and by extension HIV transmission thus reduction of viral load is assumed.
- All sex workers should be given an opportunity to engage in choices beyond sex work.
