

The Royal Norwegian Embassy will be celebrating the Bicentenary of the Norwegian Constitution on 17<sup>th</sup> May, 2014. In this regard the Embassy in conjunction with the Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies (PRS) and in particular, the Centre for Human Rights and Peace (CHRP) at the Department, are jointly organizing a seminar on the “Kenyan and Norwegian Constitutions: Experiences and Lessons Learned” as one of the events that will mark the bicentenary celebration.
