## **UoN hosts 23rd African Human Rights Moot Court Competition**

The University of Nairobi's School of law is hosting the 23<sup>rd</sup> edition of the African Human Rights Moot competition.

This is the first time a Kenyan university is the hosting the event following the establishment of the competition in 1992.
