A.1. INTRODUCTION

This proposal is a request for technical assistance for training in Kenya. It is initiated by Kenya as a consequence and further consolidation of the regional training programme organised by the Centre for Housing Studies in Dar-es-Salaam.

The concept of a regional training course rather than a national training course was a choice based on a number of grounds.

According to the CESO evaluation of the CHS(1), there is no sufficient capacity in each individual country, there is a lack of financial means to set up courses immediately in each country and there is the advantage of experience.

However, the need for training in Kenya is so large, that the Centre for Housing Studies in Dar-es-Salaam cannot meet this demand. It is therefore logical that a proposal for decentralisation of training activities is formulated and considered as a natural step in the regionalisation process of the C.H.S.

Since 1979 the C.H.S. is successfully organising regional courses in the field of low-income housing which frequently have been attended by professionals from Kenya.

A regular contact has been established between the C.H.S. and the University of Nairobi, i.e. the Housing Research and Development Unit in terms of participation/ exchange of staff for training and/or research activities, and exchange of research findings and documentation.

The Centre for Housing Studies is a cooperation between Bouwcentrum International Education in Rotterdam and the ARDHI-Institute in Dar-es-Salaam financed from the International Education Fund from the Netherlands Government.
